Improvement of Goodwin Street for drainage improvements and pedestrian safety in a low to moderate income neighborhood. The roadway has no pedestrian facilities and has had a vehicle pedestrian accident resulting in a fatality and a vehicle bicycle accident. Improvements include acquisition of additional ROW for an 8' wide multi-use pathway, bridge replacement, reconstruction in expanded ROW to enable the construction of new drainage infrastructure, sidewalks, landscaping, and irrigation.

Improved safety for motorists and pedestrians with the multi-use path, speed control, and lighting, as well as improved drainage and stormwater conveyance systems to reduce the localized flooding during heavy rain events as well as hurricanes.

The target population is the general public and 800+ individuals are expected to be served.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome will be improved transportation conditions and improved stormwater management. The benefits will include improved safety for motorists and pedestrians as the roadway currently has no pedestrian facilities and has had a vehicle pedestrian accident resulting in a fatality and a vehicle bicycle accident. The project will also improve drainage and stormwater conveyance systems to reduce the localized flooding during heavy rain events as well as hurricanes. Benefits will be measured with the increased safety by use of the new multi-use path, speed control, improved roadway lighting, modern stormwater infrastructure.
