### 14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Many lives will be saved as people, including students, are educated on sudden cardiac arrest (SCA), learning how to recognize it and respond with lifesaving measures. They will learn that SCA affects people of all ages and the warning signs of a cardiac condition.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds will help provide for educational materials aimed at ensuring survival from sudden cardiac arrest. A variety of age-appropriate materials will be created, such as activity books, training videos, flyers, posters, handouts, social media content, interviews, media content, informational videos, and real-life stories to personalize the message.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens will be given pertinent information on how to act not only in the case of a sudden cardiac arrest but also before one strikes. They will be armed with and empowered by knowledge to help save a life. 25% of people find themselves at some point in a situation where CPR and an AED are needed to save someone's life.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

K-12 students, youth with a cardiac condition and their families, and the general populace. 2.7 million students plus families and members of the general populace.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The educational component of these materials is paramount as they will teach real-world, life-saving skills that a high percentage of people will need in their own lives. Quickly-administered bystander interventions mean the difference between life, death and brain damage in cases of SCA. These materials will educate and empower people to act. Reaching students will unleash an army of lifesavers. The preventative measures being addressed will lead to better outcomes and appropriate treatments for those with a previously undiagnosed cardiac condition. Another key component is bringing awareness to the undiagnosed heart conditions which 1 in every 300 students has. With a diagnosis, those students can receive appropriate treatments and escape sudden cardiac death. They can also be advised on any necessary precautionary physical limitations to avoid sudden cardiac arrest, the #1 killer of student athletes.

The outcome will be measured by views, downloads, and distribution.
