4. Project/Program Description

Design options to add and/or improve capacity of Old Kings Road from 500 feet South of Town Center Blvd to Brighton Circle. In addition, design options to add and/or improve capacity and enhance operation of Town Center Link from Old Kings Road to Royal Palms.

The design option to be considered will be based off a planning study that City is in process of contracting with CPH Corporation as of February 2023. Currently, this segment of Old Kings Road is a 2-lane north/south arterial roadway just east and parallel to I-95 connecting to the north at Palm Coast Parkway. To the south of the project south of Town Center, Old Kings Road widens to four lanes connecting to SR 100.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Generate a set of construction plans to complete the capacity upgrade of Old Kings Road (from Town Center Boulevard to Brighton Circle) and the intersecting link of Town Center Parkway (from Royal Palms Parkway to Old Kings Road). The project will include over 4 miles of pedestrian/bicycle path added to Old Kings Road to improve safety; a design solution to harden the west side of Palm Coast to hurricane flooding; and a solution to enhance the State's Lehigh Trail pedestrian path.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The requested funds will be used to fund a design for this project.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Appropriate design options will be considered which leads to construction to improve capacity and enhance operation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Old Kings Rd. is a multi-county roadway that extends from Volusia County to Flagler County. The completed project will directly benefit residents and businesses along the corridor. However, there is also an added benefit that during emergency closures of I-95, Old Kings Rd. serves as a parallel corridor to serve north-south traffic.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Best outcome for this design project: 1) Design a set of plans the local government/CBD can fund on its own; 2) Design north-south bicycle/pedestrian path along Old Kings Road; 3) Design a solution to provide excellent safety for Lehigh Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail; 4) Solve an eastbound stormwater flow limitation that threatens to flood hundreds of private residences in the 100 year flood model; 5) Design a safe entrance onto Old Kings Road for a private development of 800 proposed single family homes; and 6) Design an ultra-safe, high speed, high capacity Old Kings link that serves well as an alternate to I-95 during I-95 emergency detours

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
