14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Increased competitiveness and resiliency of Florida manufacturing focusing on building the talent pipeline, upskilling incumbent workers, increasing the adoption of advanced technologies, enhancing cybersecurity practices, and building more robust, resilient supply chains. Business growth through technical assistance that will strengthen, advance, and diversify Florida's manufacturing sector. Bring services to unserved and under-served regions of the state, including rural areas. Programming will align with Florida Department of Economic Opportunity and Florida Department of Education programs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Technical assistance delivered directly to manufacturers through assessments and needs analyses, access to capital resources, continuous improvement implementation, and supply chain database for risk mitigation. Increase and improve the perception of careers to build the talent pipeline and position FL for onshore investments in the semiconductor industry. Increase access to advanced manufacturing tech in a space that can be shared with educators and industry.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Build a skilled workforce and drive industry growth with relevant transferable-skills for future in-demand careers in the semiconductor industry. Technical assistance delivered directly to manufacturers and their employees through employee retention management, apprenticeship accelerators, leadership training, incumbent worker training, and Skills for Career Success Bootcamps. Provide access to advanced manufacturing tech.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
- K-12 and university/college students, unemployed/under-employed Floridians, Florida's over 24,000 manufacturing establishments, and the over 424,000 people employed by them.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve quality of education: ensuring closer alignment between industry and education. Measured by increased enrollments in programs described above and in CTE programs.

Increase or improve economic activity: core measures include new and retained sales, cost savings and avoidance, increased capital investment, and jobs created or retained for the manufacturing industry. Measured by federal sponsor surveys clients, through a third-party, 6 to 12 months after project completion to determine the impacts realized. Workforce Development: enhance and expand skill development by increasing certification attainment. Measured by number of awarded certifications.
