14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

NAVRA is an education and training organization made up of fire fighters, paramedics, nurse and physicians. Our mission is to "prepare today's rescuers to succeed at tomorrow's challenges." It is our focus to provide platforms for rescue personnel throughout N.America and the World to share and advance rescue science and technology. We seek to develop and enhance proficiency in rescue techniques, vehicle rescue, Incident Command and pre-hospital care. NAVRA is a leading training and networking association which brings the focus of casualty centered training & rescue to operational emergency responding personnel throughout North America. Our challenges introduce world class rescue teams who compete throughout the year in events designed to challenge emergency service personnel and raise awareness of the global problem of road death and injury.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Purchase of truck needed to transport equipment for challenges and education/training sessions provided to first responders to be better prepared to save lives here in Florida. We will also host two challenges in Florida bringing fire rescue teams from across the country and globe, creating economic opportunity to host cities.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

NAVRA recently hosted an extrication and ALS Medical Challenge at Miami Dade Fire Rescue where 12 teams for extrication from fire departments across South Florida, the State and the globe. NAVRA had 15 teams participate in the medical challenge totaling nearly 200 participants hosted at areas hotels, dining in our communities, all while competing and learning better rescue techniques to save lives.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All populations in Florida are served with transfer of lifesaving techniques shared with first responders.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improved quality of education & training: In the rescue challenges we recreate realistic vehicle scenarios & insert live patients in the vehicles. The team are required to perform command, medical & technical skills & knowledge under timed conditions, to access, treat and extricate one or more patients in realistic environments. After each team completed evolution, they're debriefed by leaders in the field who give learning feedback. Protection of general public: develop & enhance proficiency in vehicle rescue techniques, vehicle rescue, Incident Command & pre-hospital care. We aim to promote injury prevention through education and awareness within all groups at risk from unintentional injury. Economic activity: NAVRA recently hosted an extrication and ALS Medical Challenge at Miami Dade Fire Rescue with 200+participants traveling to the challenges.
