a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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A new facility will allow additional programs to be developed, which will provide training for skilled mechanics / technicians in the areas of automotive, aviation and diesel mechanics. Marion County has long needed mechanical programs to support the tremendous growth in these industries. A highly skilled workforce in mechanical programs will benefit the Marion County economy. Currently, there is a shortage of trained mechanics / technicians in automotive service, automotive collision repair & refinishing's, and diesel technicians, which reduces the growth and expansion of local companies.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Education and training for new and current mechanics / technicians in automotive, diesel and aviation occupations in order to develop a skilled workforce and train current workers in new technology and processes. This facility will also serve as a local repair center for MCPS fleet automobiles, as well as the Marion Technical College CDL trucks.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Educational opportunities will be provided to Marion County citizens, as well as the citizens of the state of Florida, in programs listed as 'in demand' according to labor market statistics. The development of a much needed skilled workforce will benefit the overall economy of Marion County, benefiting all the citizens in Central Florida and the entire state of Florida.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target populations served by this project are high school students, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless and currently or formerly incarcerated persons. Marion Technical College expects to serve 80 to 100 students per year in the new facility built by this project.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

A new facility will allow additional programs to be developed, which will provide training for skilled mechanics / technicians in the areas of automotive, aviation and diesel mechanics. Marion County has long needed mechanical programs to support the tremendous growth in these industries.
