The proposed project does not provide direct services to citizens; however, it enhances the quality of life for residents by improving public infrastructure.

The proposed citywide project improves stormwater management for the approximately 8,000 residents of North Bay Village, and protects Florida's natural resources.

Outcome (1) Reduce the quantity of debris and litter entering the stormwater drainage system. Measure (1): Completing the project and tracking debris collected during maintenance activities. Outcome (2) Improve water quality in the environmentally sensitive Biscayne Bay and the Biscayne Aquifer. Measure (2): Reduction of debris and litter from drain systems along the Biscayne Bay shoreline within the Village's municipal boundaries.
