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a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal is to increase the readiness and ability to respond to man made and/or natural disasters within Palm Beach County's response area, and to neighboring counties as requested. Additionally, Palm Beach County Fire Rescue Urban Search & Rescue team will remain ready to assist in disaster-declared areas throughout the state. The two heavy trucks and equipment are necessary to deploy equipment through-out the 1769 squared miles served and the 19 municipalities relying on PBCFR to provide service. The team will provide service to nearly 1.5 million residents and visitors within greater Palm Beach County while adhering to and recognizing the requirements of a Type IV team.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Palm Beach County Fire Rescue has allocated funds to build a training prop necessary to train for building collapse. Members have been trained and obtained certifications for expedited deployment to the community they serve. Ongoing training will be provided to create readily deployable manpower required to fully staff the search and rescue team. Additionally drills will be conducted regularly to test deployment readiness and standing plans will be adjusted as necessary to meet any response requirements.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Urban Search and Rescue response to man made and natural disasters thought the county. The county is prone to Hurricanes, Storms and susceptible to man made disasters.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Over 1.5 million residents will be served by the team's state of readiness and local deployment. Palm Beach County's service area includes a diverse community with 4 major hospitals, over 250 Assisted Living Facilities and Nursing Homes, 9 correctional facilities, 2 major power plants, 5 wastewater facilities, 17 potable water treatment plants, 5 airports, 2 major highways systems, 4 major sugar mills/refinery, over 15 major Distribution Centers, over 350 schools, 2 colleges with numerous campuses, rail systems, hazardous substance chemical plants, sports stadiums, raceway, wildlife areas, Lake Okeechobee, Herbert Hoover Dike-levee, 45 miles of Atlantic Ocean coastline and beaches and 20 drawbridges across the Intracoastal or other waterway. Palm Beach County is a hot spot for tourism and seasonal retirees. Additionally, PBCFR has automatic and mutual aid agreements with all of the Fire Departments within the County and 3 Fire Departments in surrounding counties.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected outcome is a fully operational Urban Search and Rescue Team to serve the community and surrounding region. Palm Beach County Fire Rescue has faithfully assisted with response and recovery efforts throughout the state over the years. Palm Beach County Fire Rescue's Urban Search and Rescue Team state of readiness with further expand the County's ability to assist those in need if and when disasters occur.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The contracting agency may consider liquidated damages based on a monthly audit after a written warning outlining the items that fail to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract has been discussed. If after 1 month a financial deduction would occur in the amount of \$1,000 per month until remediation has been achieved.
