#### **SB 7016: HEALTH CARE**

This week, I'd like to spotlight SB 7016, the 'Live Healthy' Health Care bill, a comprehensive health care reform aimed at addressing the expansion of Florida's healthcare workforce. I did vote for the bill which will help broaden access to care. However, my debate focused on concerns about the advanced birthing centers, the low Medicaid reimbursement rate, managed care plans, and the potential decline in uninsured or low-income health care services at birthing centers or private care facilities.



#### SB 462: EXCUSAL FROM JURY SERVICE

I co-sponsored a bipartisan bill that proposes excuse women who have given birth within six months of the reporting date on jury summonses upon their request.
