4. Project/Program Description

The JCC Maccabi Games® are an Olympic-style sporting competition held each summer in North America. It's the world's largest organized sports program for Jewish teenagers, ages 12 to 16. ACCESS are the section of the Games® designed for participants with intellectual and developmental disabilities, ages 12 to 22. Projected participation includes 1800 athletes world-wide, 100 Access, 400 coaches, 1500 volunteers, 7500+ spectators, 500 community partners/vendors, 1000 support personnel. Through various government and private partnerships, this week-long, multi-sport event will take place at various venues throughout Broward County including DPJCC, Nova Southeastern University, FLA Live Arena, Broward County Schools, local municipalities, and Broward County Parks. Another component of the JCC Maccabi Games® is JCC Cares; a hands-on community service project that provides all athletes with the opportunity to significantly impact their host community in a meaningful way.

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Specific purpose of the funding is for safety and security for the week-long event throughout Broward County.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding is specifically for detailed law enforcement officers to provide safety/security at all venues and points of arrivals/departures. Population being served is people of all ages: 15,000 visitors, 1,800 Jewish athletes, 100 Access athletes, 400 coaches, 1,500 volunteers, 7,500 spectators, 500 community partners/vendors & 1,000 personnel support for the success of this major global event.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

This appropriation funding request is explicitly to provide enhanced safety and security at all venues, sporting events and utilized facilities throughout Broward County. Visible and proactive measures ensure that all participants, athletes, volunteers, coaches, families and the community at large remain safe and secure from any possible harm or unexpected threat.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All Broward County residents. Visiting athletes and families; elderly persons; persons with poor physical health; economically disadvantage persons; developmentally disabled persons; physically disabled; grade school students; high school students and general. >25,000 people.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The measurable benefit is the peace of mind afforded to all participants including athletes, coaches, visitors, volunteers and community partners knowing that their safety and security is being prioritized in a world where violent Antisemitic crimes is on the rise.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Repayment of state funds.
