14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

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This project is developed to provide housing for chronically homeless and at-risk female veterans and potentially their families. In the State of Florida, there are less than 30 transitional housing beds dedicated to female veterans. We have been unable to find a single transitional house dedicated to single female veterans with families. The funding would more than double the availability of transitional housing beds dedicated to female veterans.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The construction of this facility will enable the female veterans a supportive environment to learn essential job skills and personal finance. Through the US Department of Veterans Affairs, an on site case manager, and each other the veterans will get the emotional and mental health they need.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Through our program, the veterans will be better equipped to provide for themselves. The citizens of Florida will get a better person back in housing and off the streets.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Female veterans are who we are targeting. They are typically homeless due to financial issues, spousal abuse, drug addictions to name a few. We estimate that in 10 years that we will have helped 424 female veterans and up to 50 family members. That doesn't include the homes that will be built independent of this appropriations request. If we include those we are closer to 700 veterans and 100 family members.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit is we will have less veterans turning to the streets to live. This will be measured by Homeless Information Management System (HIMS) showing less veterans homeless in the Continuum of Care Point in Time counts. Each veteran will be logged into HIMS with the Big Bend Continuum of Care. It will allow us to have a record if they become homeless again.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The requested funding is being utilized to construct residential properties for homeless and at risk female veterans and potentially their families. Warrior's Restoration, Inc. staff is used to meeting contract requirements of the federal and state governments. However, this funding request is strictly related to the cost of construction of residential transitional housing.
