This project will include purchase of land and collocation of an existing station with Fire Administration, which will increase efficiencies by removing the overlap and improve health and safety of fire personnel with clearly defined personal spaces. The new 19,000 sq. ft. facility will include twelve offices, two conference rooms, one training room, thirteen dormitories and four bays.

**c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?**

This funding will ensure an effective emergency medical services response facility providing paramedic level response/transport to an increased number of people within an 8- minute travel time and firefighting capabilities within a 5-mile driving distance to reduce loss of life and property.

**d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?**

The target population is considered the general population of more than 800. Flagler County residents will all benefit from the new fire station by having a better equipped facility and the resources needed to reduce travel time, loss of life and property.

**e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?**

Quicker and more effective response to emergency medical and trauma related incidents. This facility will also provide quicker response to incidents of wildland fires threatening homes and other fires in structures. The new fire station will provide better sleeping quarters that are separate from the vehicles which emit cancer causing exhaust fumes and loud noises and will result in less sleep deprivation causing physical and mental health issues. Finally as the community grows there will be a need for more fire personnel and with the new facility Flagler County will be prepared for this growth.
