4. Project/Program Description

The funds will be utilized at the Gadsden Correctional Facility, as well as the Panama City and Miami North Community Release Centers (CRCs) to provide residents serving the last 6-12 months of their sentences with the skills and resources they need to transition successfully upon release. Shaping Success for Re-entry will deliver a structured behavior management system, individualized case management, and personalized re-entry plans at Gadsden; Persevere will deliver a coding program and structured re-entry program at Gadsden; and MTC's College Connections initiative will provide funding for facility upgrades at the Panama City and Miami North CRCs to better deliver programs, as well as funding for partnerships between Northwest Florida State College and the Panama City CRC, and between Florida International University and the Miami North CRC, to deliver short-term industry certificates to residents in high-demand, high-wage occupations.

14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds will be used at three correctional facilities (Gadsden, Panama City CRC, Miami North CRC) to build behavioral (cognitive), academic, vocational, and durable (employability) skills that will empower residents to achieve independence, financial stability, and career success upon their release. The goal is to substantially reduce recidivism rates of residents participating in these programs.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The funds are being requested to implement a systematic approach to effective re-entry programming, including genderresponsive services, intensive case management, positive behavior management, training in computer coding, and college courses for incarcerated individuals.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

The funds are being requested to implement a systematic approach to effective re-entry programming, including genderresponsive services, intensive case management, positive behavior management, training in computer coding, and college courses for incarcerated individuals.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Incarcerated persons. 800+

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will

be measured?

Developing the social/emotional, and technical skills that are the focus of both Shaping Success for Re-entry and the coding program will empower residents to be more employable, at higher wages, more quickly. The outcomes will be measured in several ways, including at minimum: program participation, number of mental health referrals, disciplinary infractions, percent of program completions/certifications, inmates' satisfaction/perception, incentive/sanction grid usage and staff feedback. Number of individuals obtaining employment, together with wage data, within 3 months and 6 months of release.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?
