As a barrier island city, bounded on one side by the Intra-coastal Waterway and the other by the Atlantic Ocean, the City is active in its marine patrol operations. With these requested funds, the Sunny Isles Beach Police Department will be able to ensure effective and efficient emergency operations across the waterways.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

If an emergency incident occurs in the waterways surrounding the city, the marine patrol unit will be able to rapidly respond and provide critical relief and assistance to the community. Additionally, consistent patrol of our waters and enforcement of boating laws reduces the risk of speeding and boating accidents that often lead to property damage, harm to marine life, and injuries or fatalities to persons.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The general public including residents and tourists. Total population who may be served by this project is over 100,000 per year of boaters and waterfront property owners.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

By ensuring law enforcement has access to equipment and provisions necessary for marine emergency response across the waterways, we can take major steps to reinforce our emergency relief capabilities for the benefit of the citizens of Sunny Isles Beach. Emergency response time is a key metric that we use to determine effective deployment.
