14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

This stormwater improvement project is to restore consistent conveyance in the existing drainage systems, improve infrastructure, improve water quality and increase flood storage capacity in the canals to reduce flooding frequency. The funding requested is for planning and design only.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?



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The proposed improvements include re-grading of roadside swales and ditches, upsizing of cross drain culverts, pond siting and property acquisition, and acquiring easements to access drainage facilities for maintenance. The canals identified need to be widened and have a standard revetment installed to protect against erosion and increase flood storage capacity.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Currently, there are several roadway projects and canals in need of stormwater related improvements for drainage efficiency and to reduce flood frequency of the area's developed. Potential communities impacted/benefited by project implementation.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Overall the general population of approximately 130K will benefit from stabilized stormwater infrastructure to prevent flooding and control erosion. Traveling on roadways will not be hampered by overtopping of canals and flooding streets. There is a direct benefit to many communities including Rima Ridge, Ormond Beach, Sea Colony, Armand Beach, Hammock Beach Estates, Johnson Beach, Hammock Dunes and Old Haw Creek Road Communities. There are critical assets that will also be protected from potential flooding including the Hammock Community Center, Hammock Community Volunteer Fire Department, Sheriff's Office Substation, Old Hammock Plantation Wastewater Treatment Plant, County owned parcels adjoining the canal side, Amvets Post 59, and the Flagler County Jail.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improvement of the roadside drainage condition by stabilizing stormwater infrastructure to make it more resilient and resistant to flooding and erosion will improve the transportation conditions and water quality. The reduction of pollutant contribution will also improve ecological conditions for fish and wildlife by limiting their exposure. The measures used include monitoring the occurrence of flooding, erosional impacts and water quality and water testing to see the level of pollutants contained in the surface water.
