a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Completing design of this project will allow the State or County to apply for construction funding for this project from State or Federal sources.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

This project will procure a design consultant to develop plans for the 2 lane to 4 lane reconstruction of State Road 24.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

No direct services are to be provided. However, the eventual construction of additional lanes in this corridor will provide enhanced travel times and capacity for residents of Alachua and Levy Counties.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This segment of roadway currently serves 23,500 average annual daily trips. Users of the roadway largely include residents of Levy and Alachua County. Several construction firms use this roadway to get in the Gainesville metropolitan area from Archer and Levy County.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Expected outcome of the project will be final plans for a 2-lane to 4-lane reconstruction of State Road 24. This will be measured by delivery of final plans within the budgeted amount.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

The County considers FDOTs existing standard penalties as sufficient to ensure the project is delivered on-time and within budget.
