14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Improving the Miami River District's economy and natural environment. Assist job generating business in the Miami River District. Improve the environment via removing illegal dumping, invasive plant species, new plantings, water decontamination, etc. Host public meetings, website, etc. Market and promote the multi-use, multi-cultural, multi-income Miami River District, which includes Miami downtown, Little Havana and Overtown areas.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Assisting new private sector businesses to open along the Miami River. Removing illegal dumping materials and invasive plant species clean-up, including state-owned submerged lands. Scavenger Water Decontamination Vessel services, collect floating debris while decontaminating 600,000 gallons of River water per hour, and injecting 150,000 litters of oxygen into the Miami River every hour, significantly improving water quality. Plantings, landscaping, painting over graffiti along the public Riverwalk.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Scavenger Water Decontamination Vessel services improving water quality. New plantings, landscaping, painting over graffiti along the public Riverwalk. Assist businesses with due diligence and the processes to open. Assist citizens with any issue related to the Miam River. Host and provide supplies for volunteer Miami River clean up events. Maintain the community vegetable and fruit garden. Frequent updates of the informative website, www.miamirivercommission.org

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

South Florida which uses the public Riverwalk and its 9 major parks. The Miami River District has the most densely populated neighborhoods in the State of Florida, including downtown Miami, Brickell, Little Havana, Overtown, Allapattah, Durham Park, Spring Garden, Grove Park, and Melrose. Miami River District attracts new businesses, which create new jobs.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Significantly improving the Miami River District's economy by assisting businesses and improving it's natural environment by removing garbage, Water Decontamination, new plantings, etc. The outcome will be measured by the number of new businesses, quantity of cubic yards of collected and disposed garbage and invasive plant species, number of gallons of decontaminated Miami River water, number of assisted job generating businesses.
