a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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Providing access to legal resources and services to the underserved population and those with limited resources. The program will assist this demographic with all non-criminal matters, from filing pleadings or responses to assistance at trial or administrative matters.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Community based initiatives, bringing attorneys and resources to the underserved communities, providing panels and discussion forums to educate and inform residents, offering flexible schedules to ensure persons of varying needs are accommodated, offering multiple access points via social media, video/teleconference and in person support, and assisting with legal matters and litigation.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Attorneys and staff will provide legal services to the citizens assisting them in all legal matters within the scope of the program at no cost to them. Offering counseling and legal support by a trained attorney in the practice of law. Citizens will have an advocate for their pending matter and access to services and resources of the organization.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The targeted population to be served are elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, homeless, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, and university/college students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Objective is to provide legal services and representation to those with limited resources and access to said services. Part of the program requires measurable deliverables as relates to clients served, cases resolved, and community-based programs/ training sessions that have been provided throughout the year, per quarter.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Should any deliverable not be met within the specifications of the agreement, funds are withheld and or reduced from the total allocation. Should the program not deliver on any deliverable, potential repayment penalty is also available at the discretion of the contracting agency.
