4. Project/Program Description

The City of Delray Beach is requesting funding to enhance conditions at The Delray Beach Historical Society Museum and Archives. This facility, which is owned by and the grounds maintained by the City, is home to Delray Beach Historical Society (DBHS) which operates a museum, gardens, and the City's designated historical archives out of three historic homes on the property. The property has seen an increase in visitors including tourists, researchers, locals, and area students. Site improvements to create the historic gardens have created areas of standing stormwater. Deficiencies in existing parking exacerbate the drainage issue as well as provide inadequate parking given the DBHS' growth. These conditions create a safety issue, as well as detract from the aesthetics of the site, taking away from the historic experience. The City and Historical Society will repair and enhance the facility's current drainage through sitework and repair/reconfiguration of parking and yard areas.

The City and Historical Society are seeking to address site drainage issues while also addressing deficiencies in the facility's current parking facilities that impact drainage. Changes to parking will also result in and increase in the number of formal parking spaces and provide for greater safety for pedestrians and vehicles on and around the site.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Additional visitors including elderly, physically disabled, and school students from preschool through University will have an increased opportunity to visit the facility to learn from and enjoy the cultural resources contained therein.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Improved parking facilities in compliance with Federal Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements. Also improvement of onsite drainage to prevent standing water in parking and walkway areas.
