The water distribution system for the city of Opa-locka is more than 40 years old, the city is in need of replacing existing water mains, corroded iron pipe, PVC pipes that are constantly breaking and a section of asbestos cement pipes that will need to replaced in the future. The drinking water lines located in the Miami Gardens area are constantly breaking due to the age of the system The environmental impacts from the deteriorated plumbing include holes in pipes formed through corrosion, which allow the influx of contaminants into drinking water systems, the loss of the water resource itself, and resultant property damage.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The majority of funds will benefit no specific group. The expected amount of individuals to be served is over 800 persons.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve physical Health Benefit: REDUCE RISKS OF CROSS-CONTAMINATION IN DRINKING WATER SUPPLY-Water thats not properly treated or that travels through poorly maintained pipes can pose a health hazard. The, corrosion of iron pipes can occur and contaminate water. Method: To determine water quality, the city will measure and analyze through a third party the characteristics of the water such as temperature, dissolved mineral content, and number of bacteria. Improve drinking water quality: Erosion through the existing cast iron pipes have weaken the structure and allow for foreign material to enter the line, while lowering the pressure. Method: The city will sample the quality of water through lab analysis.
