a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

As one of the fastest-growing metropolitan areas, Cape Coral is in need of funding for an expanded Emergency Operations Center. The EOC expansion will serve the city's population of 200,000 residents. The existing EOC was constructed in 2001 when the city's population was 107,631 and the city is anticipated to reach a population of more than 400,000 residents in 10 years.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Cape Coral EOC expansion will allow for better coordination during all-hazards emergency response through all phases of a disaster. The city operates an All-Hazards Emergency Management Program through an interlocal agreement with Lee County to provide services to the Cape Coral community.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?
