a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



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RESTORE Act funding streams provide the opportunity to secure regional water quality improvements and sustain healthy waters on a generational scale. In order to achieve these goals, the region needs to apply advanced data analytics, regional coordination, and proactive pursuit of large grants that are proven to achieve long standing, transformational improvements in the region's infrastructure and environment.

### b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

- + Gather, clean, integrate data from 8-county Panhandle region, starting with Escambia and Santa Rosa
- + Identify hotspots of water quality degradation & habitat loss
- + Propose solutions to address drivers of water quality & water habitat
- + Probe potential effectiveness of investments in local infrastructure & habitat restoration.
- + Gather regional input on potential investments
- + Based on research, data analytics, project evaluation, and stakeholder input, work with local, state and federal partners to support and develop region-wide, data-driven RESTORE Act proposals.
- c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Local counties and regional partners will be able to leverage the water quality analytic capabilities of UWFCEDB, PPBEP, Choctawhatchee Basin Alliance, St Andrew & St. John Bays, and SAS Monitoring Network, which will lead to the preparation and submission of larger scale, transformative grant proposals. The Team will collaborate and support local partners in developing grant proposal content.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Nearly 1 million residents live in Northwest Florida and will benefit from a stronger environment and water quality.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The successful implementation of this project will enable:

- + New discoveries of key drivers of water quality hazards and ecosystem changes:
- + The development of regionally transformative environmental protection and restoration projects that will be submitted for RESTORE Act funding.

This outcome will be determined by successful funding of supported RESTORE act applications.
