14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

The goal of this project is to raise awareness of substance misuse, with a special emphasis on prescription opioid abuse. In addition, the project will address and help Florida's youth and their families to better understand the opioid overdose epidemic and to scale up prevention activities across Florida by increasing awareness of the dangers and addictive properties of opioid, including prescription medications, through social media, educational marketing campaigns and community events in partnership with licensed professionals.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Activities will include: 1) healthy peer and adult relationships; 2) small group opportunities that allow youth to develop a sense of emotional safety, peer support, trust and transparency and leverage youth choice and voice; 3) implementation of a prevention program and activities that are developmentally responsive and address all forms of substance misuse. Services will include: opioid prevention program will be provided weekly to the selected youth with pre- and post-tests to measure progress.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Direct services will include: opioid prevention program will be provided weekly to the selected youth with pre- and post-test to measure progress. The program will start with an introduction to the opioid crisis, along with assessment and planning tools for designing a prevention initiative. Part two will be providing a menu of prevention strategies – for staff, youth, families, and school and community partners. Florida's Boys & Girls Clubs work with all youth but specialize in working with highly at-risk youth and those who are no longer simply at-risk but already engaged in risky behaviors. Boys & Girls Clubs' afterschool programs provide guidance, care, evidence-based programming, and resources that keep young people in school and away from risky behaviors.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

More than 5,000 school-age children (kindergarten through 12th grade) will receive opioid and prescription drugs use prevention programs. Information about the danger in opioid and prescription drugs use along with available agencies for assistance will be provided to the families.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Equip students with the knowledge and refusal skills they need to make smart decisions and manage stress the healthy way. To raise awareness about the dangers of substance misuse and support communities touched by all forms of substance misuse. The methodology by which this outcome will be measured is through our National Youth Outcomes Initiative (NYOI), a member-reported survey, and pre- and post-tests. We will evaluate the impact of our substance abuse strategies utilizing questions from the CDC's YRBS that monitor health-risk behaviors for our middle and high school youth.
