14. Program Performance

a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?

Improved delivery of services and programs for people with special needs of all ages (children to seniors). Enhanced and expanded staff training in conflict resolution involving persons with special needs. More diverse offerings of programming and services that are inclusive for persons with special needs. Increased accommodations in Village facilities and at events for persons with special needs.



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b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

An initial assessment of Village services and policies to determine a baseline from which to build upon. Recommendations for programming adjustments and additions, improved services, modifications to policies to better address the needs of special needs residents, and staff training in how to accommodate people with special needs. Implementation of recommendations via additional staff training and increased and modified programming and services.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Citizens of all ages and abilities will receive improved services, programs, and overall engagement with Village staff, facilities, and events. More inclusive programming to accommodate persons with special needs will enhance the experience of Village offerings for everyone. The classes provided to special needs residents will have an emphasis on physical activity, natural movement, nutrition, and overall physical health. The Village will partner with Best Buddies Integrated Employment Program to assist with jobs placement for residents with special needs that are interested in being a part of the workforce.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

All special needs residents regardless of age and ability are the target population. However, all residents regardless of special needs will benefit from more inclusive services, facilities, and programming.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Mental health and physical health are critical to a high quality life and these programs will offer social, physical, and mental stimulation to maintain a strong mental and physical outlook for special needs residents. Job placement for those interested in joining the workforce will lead to economic self-sufficiency and teach valuable interpersonal skills. Staff trained to better respond to conflicts with special needs residents will reduce the likelihood these residents will unnecessarily encounter the criminal/juvenile justice system. Number of job placements, resident feedback, and incident reports for conflicts will provide the data necessary to measure progress on these outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for the contract?

Failure to meet deliverables will result in the forfeiture of funds or financial penalties as described in the contract.
