a. What specific purpose or goal will be achieved by the funds requested?



Introduction of high school students and teachers to the maritime workforce and to the various career opportunities available, as well as learning through engaging cross-curricular marine related materials, lessons, and student activities. Students will learn concepts of navigation, physics, geography, geometry, and other techniques and mathematical concepts to plot basic theoretical coordinates and more.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A thorough understanding of the available careers in the maritime industry, many related to STEM based occupations such as marine engineers, captains, machinists, navigation and electronic radar, as well as deck crew, culinary, housekeeping, and food services. Participants will be given basic foundational skills and details on STCW certification and standard of training, certification, and watch keeping.

Immediate job opportunities are available throughout the maritime industry. There is a serious shortage of workers. Jobs are now available and many are coupled with opportunities for advancing and obtaining certification and rising in the ranks through career enhancement and training in various areas of the industry. Many maritime jobs pay above average wages. Most crew have quarters on the vessels which helps them on their way to self sufficiency. While they work, they save to become self sufficient and secure their own housing. If there is an available trained workforce to staff businesses, more vessels for transport, ferry, charter, dining, fishing, cruising and other water craft activities will be available to tourists and residents to enjoy our oceans, lakes, and rivers. Outcomes will be measured in several categories such as job placement, self sufficiency, promotion, certification, physical and mental health improvement, revenue increases for businesses and economic development.
