The project will protect the City's groundwater quality and supply.

The construction of a centralized sewer system will meet the intended purpose of these funds.

Wastewater services will be directly provided to the properties within the project's 51-acre area.

This project will connect 70 industrial /commercial properties to a centralized sewer system on approximately 51 acres.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected benefit of this project will improve the water quality and result in a reduction of nutrients in the surface and groundwater. This commercial and industrial area has been hindered by the lack of a central wastewater system. This construction should spur development/redevelopment in the area.
