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The state's investment would create a digital concert hall that leverages technology platforms to reach, capture, and draw an infinite audience that is attracted to and eager to invest in Florida's economic and cultural future. A one-time state investment of \$500,000 would allow TFO to strengthen state and local economies by cementing St. Petersburg's identity as a national and global cultural center for tourists and residents alike.

b. What activities and services will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

A one-time state investment of \$500,000 would allow the Florida Orchestra to boost the local economy by leveraging local and private support to bring an unlimited audience to the region.

c. What direct services will be provided to citizens by the appropriation project?

Visitors and citizens statewide, nationally, and globally would have access to the Florida Orchestra's content.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

This project will reach an unlimited number of Florida tourists and residents.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

An increase in the visitors/audience at the Orchestra's events will play an increased role as an essential economic driver, increasing local tourism, payroll, and enrich cultural experiences for a wider and more diverse audience beyond the confines of the concert hall including Florida residents in areas without any or easy access to orchestral concerts and music experiences.
