



#### Total Budget \$83.5 Billion




### General Revenue \$30.8 Billion

#### FIGHTING for Florida's Students


Major Issues Funded	Funding Amount
Performance Funding for Colleges	\$100 million
Performance Funding for Universities	\$600 million
Performance Funding for Workforce Programs	\$4.5 million
Performance Incentives for Colleges	\$10 million

The Governor's budget <u>DOES NOT</u> recommend a tuition increase for State Universities, State Colleges, and School District Workforce Programs, and freezes all fees at our State Universities and State Colleges.

#### State University System Highlights


\$75.2 Million Increase Over Current Year Operating Funding Includes:

- Performance Funding Provides \$600 million total (\$50 million new state funds)
- Preeminence and Emerging Preeminence Maintains \$70 million and \$10 million, respectively, for universities designated as preeminent and emerging preeminent

#### Florida College System Highlights

- Performance Funding Provides \$100 million total
- **Summer Dual Enrollment** \$5.6 million for students dual enrolled in the Summer term
- Performance Incentives Maintains \$10 million to colleges for students earning high-demand industry certifications



#### Student Financial Aid Highlights

- Bright Futures Scholarships Fully funds at \$217.3 million based on latest estimating conference
- Florida Academic Scholars \$12.9 million to increase the per credit award amount for the top scholars by 10%
- Summer Bright Futures Provides \$34.7 million to provide
   Bright Futures funding for credit hours taken during the summer term
