COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE - Substantial Changes

I. Summary:

CS/SB 216 clarifies for certain students (e.g., foster care children), and establishes for all students provisions relating to exemptions from the payment of tuition and fees at public postsecondary education institutions and for workforce education programs provided by school districts. Specifically, the bill:

- Exempts students who were adopted from the Department of Children and Families or who were in the custody of the department under specified circumstances from the payment of tuition and fees.
- Provides for the adoption of rules and regulations and the application of such rules and regulations to all students who are granted tuition and fee exemptions, which:
 - o Prohibit or eliminate restrictions on courses that such students may take, and
 - o Expand student access to tuition and fee exemption eligibility information.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2016.

II. Present Situation:

The Legislature has enacted laws to make higher education affordable to students in Florida.

Tuition and Fees

The term "tuition" is defined as "the basic fee charged to a student for instruction provided by a public postsecondary educational institution in this state." An "out-of-state fee" is the additional fee for instruction provided by a public postsecondary educational institution charged to a student who does not qualify for the in-state tuition rate."

A student who is classified as a "resident for tuition purposes" is a student who qualifies for the in-state tuition rate.³ A "non-resident for tuition purposes" is defined as a "person who does not qualify for the in-state tuition rate," and pays the out-of-state fee in addition to tuition.

Florida law affords exemptions⁵ and waivers⁶ from fees for students who meet specified criteria.

Fee Exemptions

The following students are exempt from the payment of tuition and fees, including lab fees, at a school district that provides workforce education programs, Florida College System (FCS) institution, or state university:⁷

- A student enrolled in a dual enrollment or early admission program.
- A student enrolled in an approved apprenticeship program.
- A student who is or was at the time he or she reached 18 years of age in the custody of the Department of Children and Families (DCF or department) or who, after spending 6 months in the custody of the department after reaching 16 years of age, was placed in a guardianship by the court. The exemption remains valid until the student reaches 28 years of age.
- A student who is or was at the time he or she reached 18 years of age in the custody of a relative or a nonrelative or who was adopted from the DCF after May 5, 1997. The exemption remains valid until the student reaches 28 years of age.
- A student who enrolled in an employment and training program under the welfare transition program.
- A student who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence or whose primary nighttime residence is a public or private shelter designed to provide temporary residence for individuals intended to be institutionalized, or a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular accommodation for human beings.
- A student who is a proprietor, owner, or worker of a company whose business has been at least 50 percent negatively financially impacted by the buyout of property around Lake Apopka by the State of Florida. The exemption is valid for a period of 4 years after the date that the postsecondary education institution confirms that the conditions of this paragraph have been met.

• Child protection and child welfare personnel who are enrolled in an accredited bachelor's degree or master's degree in social work program, provided that the student attains at least a grade of "B" in all courses for which tuition and fees are exempted.

The law authorizes each FCS institution to grant student fee exemptions from all fees adopted by the State Board of Education (SBE or state board) and the FCS institution board of trustees for up to 54 full-time equivalent (FTE) students or 1 percent of the institution's total FTE enrollment, whichever is greater, at each institution.⁸ During the 2013-2014 academic year, FCS institutions provided fee exemptions to more than 72,740 students, which amounted to \$94 million in tuition exemptions.⁹ Students who lived as foster children, lived with a relative or nonrelative, or were adopted after being wards of the State accounted for 3,142 of these exemptions, which amounted to \$5,570,487.78 in tuition and fee exemptions.¹⁰ Additionally, school districts granted 226 fee exemptions to such students enrolled in postsecondary career and technical education programs and 441 fee exemptions to such students enrolled in adult education programs.¹¹

Except in the case of dual enrollment students and early admit students, a regulation adopted by the Board of Governors of the State University System of Florida (BOG) limits the fee exemption benefits to apply only to undergraduate degree programs, not exceeding 120 credit hours, ¹² unless the program requirements exceed 120 credit hours for a degree. ¹³ For students who are or were in the custody of the DCF, as specified, the regulation requires students to provide a certification of eligibility from the DCF to the state university in which such students seek to enroll. ¹⁴ Such students ¹⁵ received 548 fee exemptions granted by the state universities during the 2013-2014 academic year, which amounted to a \$2,849,049 in fee exemptions. ¹⁶ Additionally, 37 undergraduate students enrolled at state universities received a homeless student tuition and fee waiver during the 2013-2014 academic year. ¹⁷

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

CS/SB 216 clarifies for certain students (e.g., foster care children), and establishes for all students provisions relating to exemptions from the payment of tuition and fees at a school district that provides workforce education programs, Florida College System (FCS) institution, or state university; and requires each FCS institution and state university to adopt rules and regulations, respectively, to administer tuition and fee exemptions.

Student Eligibility for Tuition and Fee Exemptions

The bill removes the age requirement for a child who, after spending six months in the custody of the DCF, is placed in a guardianship by the court. ¹⁸ Current law provides for tuition and fee exemptions for a student who is or was at the time he or she reached 18 years of age in the custody of the DCF or who, after spending at least six months in the department's custody after reaching 16 years of age, was placed in a guardianship by the court. ¹⁹ In effect, the bill extends eligibility for tuition and fee exemptions to a student who has spent at least six months in the custody of the DCF before placement in a guardianship by the court, regardless of the student's age at the time of the custody.

Additionally, the bill removes current restrictions on student eligibility for such exemptions by:

- Expanding tuition and fee exemption benefits to any student who is or was adopted from the DCF and who has not reached 28 years of age,²⁰ and eliminating an existing eligibility criteria that extends tuition and fee exemption benefits to students who were adopted from the DCF after May 5, 1997.
- Clarifying that a student who is or was at the time he or she reached 18 years of age in the custody of the DCF and is or was placed with a nonrelative in a shelter²¹ is eligible for tuition and fee exemptions until the student reaches 28 years of age. Current law limits the provision regarding a student's placement with nonrelatives to apply to "nonrelatives who are willing to assume the custody and care of a dependent child in the role of a substitute parent as a result of a court's determination of child abuse, neglect, or abandonment and subsequent placement with the nonrelative caregiver."²²
- Clarifying existing tuition and fee exemption provision concerning a student's placement
 with a relative to also apply to a relative who is not or was not a participant in the Relative
 Caregiver Program. Current law limits the provision regarding a student's placement with
 relatives to apply to the relatives who qualify for and participate in the Relative Caregiver
 Program.²³

Applicability of Tuition and Fee Exemptions

The bill requires each FCS institution and state university to adopt rules and regulations, respectively, to administer tuition and fee exemptions, and requires such rules and regulations to apply to all students who qualify for tuition and fee exemptions including, but not limited to, the students who are or were in the custody of the DCF.²⁴:

- Prohibit a restriction on the number of credit hours that may be earned by a student;
- Allow a student to enroll in remedial courses;
- Eliminate limitations on the type of courses in which a student may enroll;
- Require the Department of Education, and each FCS institution, and state university to post tuition and fee exemption information on their respective websites; and
- Require financial aid officers at the FCS institutions and state universities to contact and advice students who indicate their eligibility for a tuition and fee exemptions on a financial aid form. The bill does not specify if the financial aid form must be the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).²⁵

As a result, the rules and regulations will increase transparency regarding tuition and fee exemptions including, but not limited to, eligibility requirements for such exemptions, and expand benefits for all students who are exempt from the payment of tuition and fees.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2016.

I. Summary:

SB 878 authorizes medical faculty certificates to be issued to qualified full-time faculty appointed to teach at the Florida Atlantic University, consistent with current law for the other accredited medical schools in Florida. Additionally, the bill revises the name of the Mayo Medical School at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida to the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine in Jacksonville, Florida.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2016.

II. Present Situation:

Section 458.3145, F.S., allows the Department of Health (DOH) to issue medical faculty certificates to qualified physicians licensed in another jurisdiction, who have accepted a full time faculty position at an accredited Florida medical school, to practice medicine in that school's affiliated clinical facilities or teaching hospitals, without sitting for, and passing, a licensure examination.

Applicants seeking a medical faculty certificate must meet all of the following requirements:

- Have graduated from an accredited medical school listed with the World Health Organization;
- Hold a current, valid license to practice medicine in another jurisdiction;
- Have completed an approved residency or fellowship of at least 1 year or received training which has been determined by the Board to be equivalent to the 1 year requirement;
- Have been offered and accepted a full-time faculty appointment to teach in a program of medicine at:
 - University of Florida;
 - o University of Miami;

- University of South Florida;
- o Florida State University;
- o Florida International University;
- o University of Central Florida; and
- o Mayo Medical School at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida.

Florida Atlantic University is not included in that list. Legislation authorizing Florida Atlantic University's medical education program was signed into law by the Governor May 15, 2010.¹

The medical faculty certificate is valid until the earlier of termination of the physician's relationship with the medical school or after a period of 24 months. The certificate is renewable and may be extended for 2 years if the physician provides a certification from the dean of the medical school that the physician is a distinguished medical scholar and an outstanding practicing physician. The maximum number of extended Medical faculty certificate holders is limited to 30 persons per each medical school, with the exception of the Mayo Clinic, which is limited to 10 certificate holders.²

As of the date of this analysis, there are 42 clear and active physicians who hold Medical faculty certificates.³ Medical faculty at the listed medical schools may also hold unrestricted medical licenses issued through licensure by examination or licensure by endorsement according to the requirements in ss. 458.311 and 458.313, F.S., respectively. Holding an unrestricted medical license through either one of those avenues would not require a physician on the faculty to obtain a medical faculty certificate.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

SB 878 expands the current medical faculty certificate eligibility criteria by allowing a medical faculty certificate to be issued to an individual who has been offered and who has accepted a full-time faculty appointment to teach in a program of medicine at the Florida Atlantic University.

The bill also limits the number of extended medical faculty certificate holders at the Florida Atlantic University to 30 persons, which is consistent with the current limitations on all but one other institution (i.e., The Mayo Medical School at the Mayo Clinic in Jacksonville, Florida) ⁴ eligible for such certificates. The Mayo Medical School is one of five schools within the Mayo Clinic College of Medicine which includes the Mayo Medical School, Mayo Graduate School, Mayo School of Graduate Medical Education, Mayo School of Health Sciences, and Mayo School of Continuous Professional Development.⁵ Therefore, the bill allows a physician hired to

I. Summary:

SB 944 provides for out-of-state fee waivers for active duty members of the United States Armed Forces who reside or who are stationed outside Florida. The bill specifies that tuition and fees charged to such students must not exceed the tuition and fees charged to resident students.

Additionally, the bill requires rulemaking to administer the fee waivers to the active duty members of the United States Armed Forces and reporting to maintain a record of the number and value of all such fee waivers granted.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2016.

II. Present Situation:

The Florida Legislature has enacted laws to provide members of the Armed Forces access to public postsecondary education in the state.

Tuition and Fees

The term "tuition" is defined as "the basic fee charged to a student for instruction provided by a public postsecondary educational institution in this state." An "out-of-state fee" is the additional fee for instruction provided by a public postsecondary educational institution charged to a student who does not qualify for the in-state tuition rate."

A student who is classified as a "resident for tuition purposes" is a student who qualifies for the in-state tuition rate.³ A "non-resident for tuition purposes" is defined as a "person who does not qualify for the in-state tuition rate," and pays the out-of-state fee in addition to tuition.

Current law affords in-state tuition benefits to members of the United States military through either fee waivers or resident status for tuition purposes.

In-state Tuition

Fee Waivers

Florida law affords waivers⁵ from fees to certain students who meet specified criteria including, but not limited to, certain members of the United States military. For instance, a state university, Florida College System (FCS) institution, and technical centers must waive tuition for undergraduate college credit programs and career certificate programs, as applicable, for recipients of a Purple Heart or another combat decoration superior in precedence.⁶ Additionally, honorably discharged veterans of the United States Armed Forces, the United States Reserved Forces, or the National Guard who meet certain conditions are eligible for out-of-state fee waiver benefits through the Congressman C.W. "Bill" Young Veteran Tuition Waiver Program.⁷

Resident Status for Tuition Purposes

Active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States residing or stationed in Florida, and their spouses and dependent children, and active drilling members of the Florida National Guard are considered Florida residents for tuition purposes⁸ and accordingly receive in-state tuition and student financial aid benefits. Such benefits also apply to active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States and their spouses and dependents attending an FCS institution or state university within 50 miles of the military establishment where they are stationed, if such military establishment is within a county contiguous to Florida.⁹

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

SB 944 waives the out-of-state fee for active duty members of the United States Armed Forces who reside or who are stationed outside Florida. In effect, the bill extends in-state tuition benefit, through a fee waiver approach, to the specified United States Armed Forces members. The out-of-state fee waivers may apply to undergraduate and graduate degree programs.

Additionally, similar to the Congressman C.W. "Bill" Young Veteran Tuition Waiver Program requirements, the bill requires:

• Tuition and fees charged to a student who qualifies for the out-of-state fee waiver for the specified active duty members of the United States Armed Forces must not exceed the tuition and fees charged to a resident student.

• Each state university, Florida College System institution, and technical center to report to the Board of Governors (BOG) and the State Board of Education (SBE), as applicable, the number and value of all fee waivers granted to the active duty members of the United States Armed Forces.

- Activity and service fee.⁵
- Health fee.⁶
- Athletic fee.⁷
- Capital Improvement Trust Fund fee.⁸
- Student financial aid fee.⁹

Additionally, students may be assessed certain user fees, fines, and surcharges. 13

Fee Waivers

Florida law affords waivers from specified fees to certain students who meet identified criteria. Additionally, the law authorizes each state university board of trustees to waive tuition and out-of-state fees for purposes that support and enhance the mission of the university. All fees waived must be based on policies that are adopted by the university board of trustees which must be based on regulations adopted by the Board of Governors.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

SB 1230 requires state universities to waive any or all application fees and tuition and related fees for a graduate student who has at least a 0.25 full-time equivalent appointment as a graduate assistant, graduate research assistant, graduate research associate, or graduate teaching associate. As specified, current law provides authority to each state university board of trustees to waive tuition and out-of-state fees for purposes that support and enhance the mission of the university. The bill may limit the universities "full flexibility" to assess and waive the specified fees that support and enhance the mission of the university, as authorized in law. 18

In accordance with the law, at least 75 percent of funds from the student financial aid fee must be used to provide financial aid based on absolute need. ¹⁹ The waiver of the student financial aid fee may decrease the student financial aid funds to assist students in need. ²⁰ The technology fee, if waived, may limit a university's ability to enhance informational technology resources for students and faculty. ²¹

C. Government Sector Impact:

In the 2015-2016 academic year, all 12 state universities assessed graduate students a \$30 non-refundable application fee. An estimated 12,748 graduate students would have been eligible for the application fee waiver required in the bill, resulting in the state universities forgoing an estimated \$382,440 in application fee revenues.²⁵

An estimated 112,684 in graduate student credit hours for Fall 2015 have been accumulated based on 5,582 full-time equivalent (FTE) graduate student appointments either exceeding or equaling to 0.25 FTE as a graduate assistant, graduate research assistant, graduate teaching assistant, graduate teaching associate. The 2015-2016 state university system average for graduate tuition and related fees is \$442.05 per student credit hour. Based on 32 credit hours equaling 1 graduate FTE, the annual fee assessment may amount to \$14,146. Under this bill, the state university system may have generated \$50 million less in tuition revenues for the Fall 2015 term, which on an annual basis, results in an estimated fiscal impact of over \$100 million less in tuition revenues.
