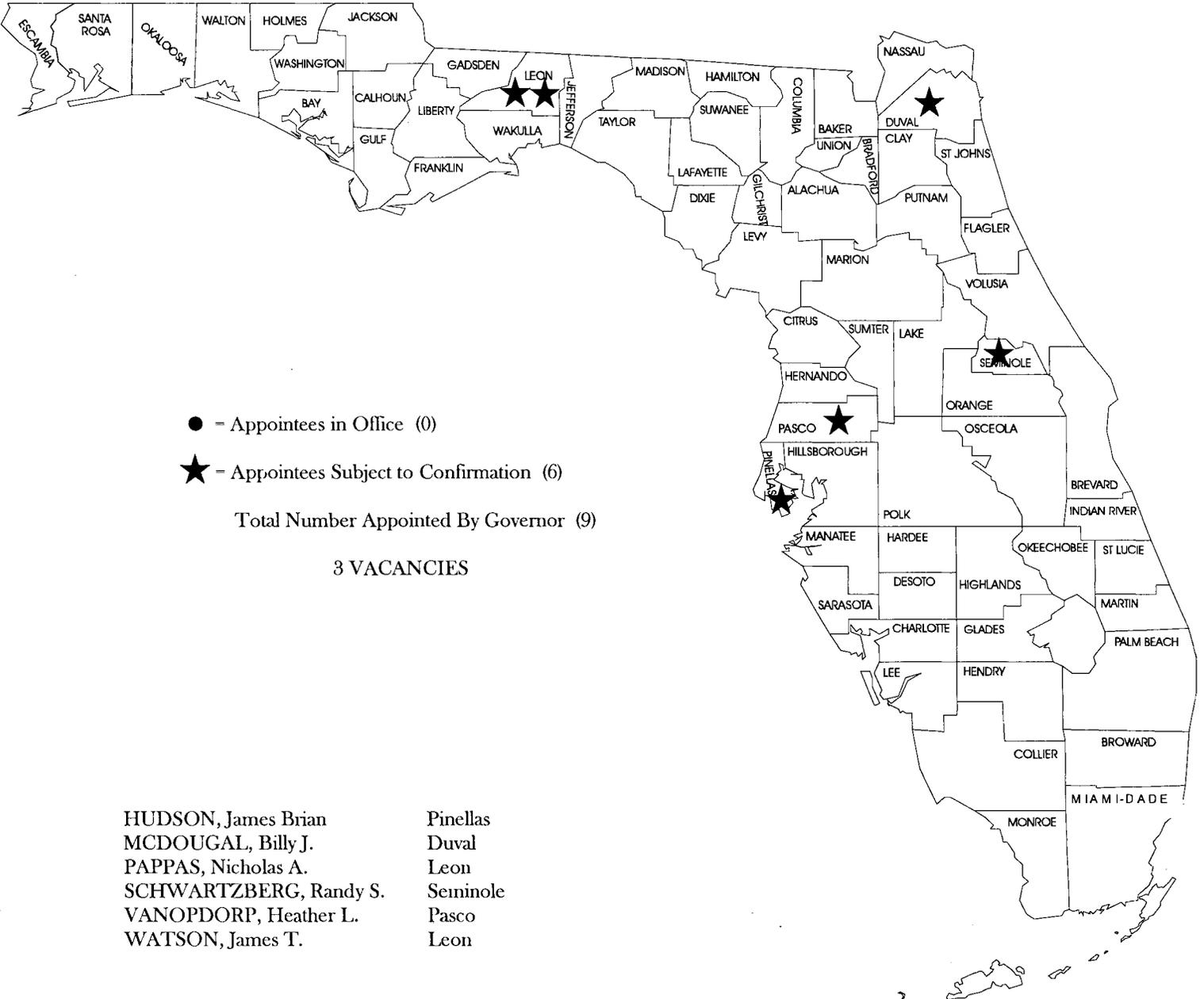

Compensation: A board member shall be compensated fifty dollars for each day he or she attends an official board meeting and for each day he or she participates in any other board business. A board member shall also be entitled to reimbursement for expenses pursuant to s. 112.061, F. S. Travel out of the state shall require the prior approval of the secretary of the department.

Requirements: The nine-member board shall include:

- Five licensed athletic trainers
- One physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459
- One physician licensed under chapter 460
- Two members shall be consumer members, each of whom must be a resident of this state who has never worked as an athletic trainer, who has no financial interest in the practice of athletic training and who has never been a licensed health care practitioner as defined in s. 456.001(4), F.S.

Additional Requirements: Terms are for four years. Terms expire on October 31st. For the purpose of staggering terms, the Governor shall appoint the initial members of the board as follows: Three members for terms of 2 years each. Three members for terms of 3 years each. Three members for terms of 4 years each. As the terms of the members expire, the Governor shall appoint successors for terms of 4 years and such members shall serve until their successors are appointed. Required to file Form 1 with the Commission on Ethics.

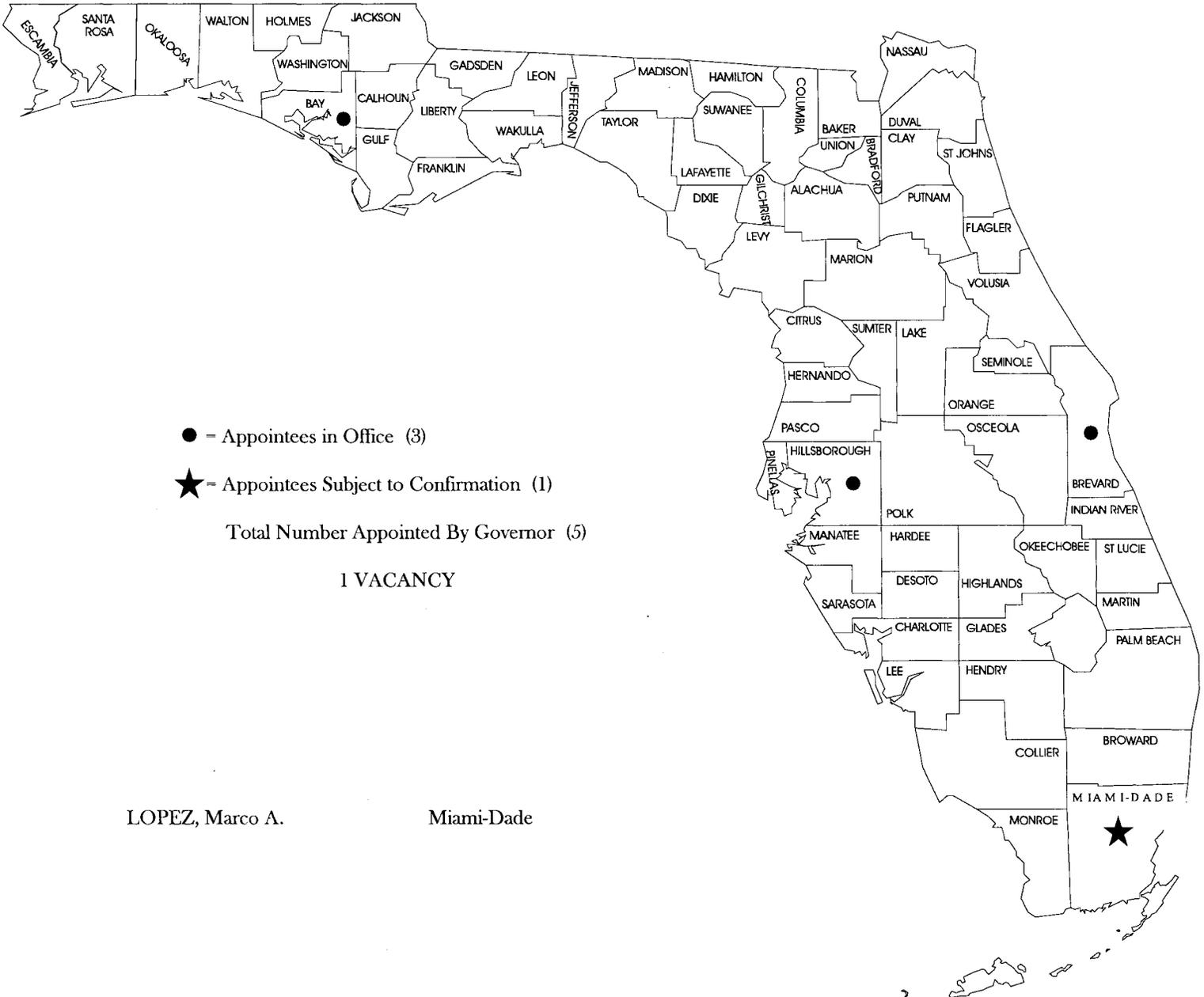

One member must be a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 458 or chapter 459, who must maintain an unencumbered license in good standing, and who must, at the time of her or his appointment, have practiced medicine for at least 5 years.

No member or employee of the commission shall be a member of, belong to, contract with, or receive any compensation from, any person or entity who sanctions, arranges, or promotes professional boxing or who otherwise has a financial interest in an active boxer currently registered with a boxing registry. (Rule 61K1-1.0023)

Additional Requirements: Terms are for four years. Three consecutive unexcused absences or absences constituting 50 percent or more of the commission's meetings within any 12-month period shall cause the commission membership of the member in question to become void, and the position shall be considered vacant. Required to file Form 1 with the Commission on Ethics.

Notes: Number 19 - Mr. Lopez worked for the Florida Boxing Commission as a District Coordinator from 1993 to 2006.

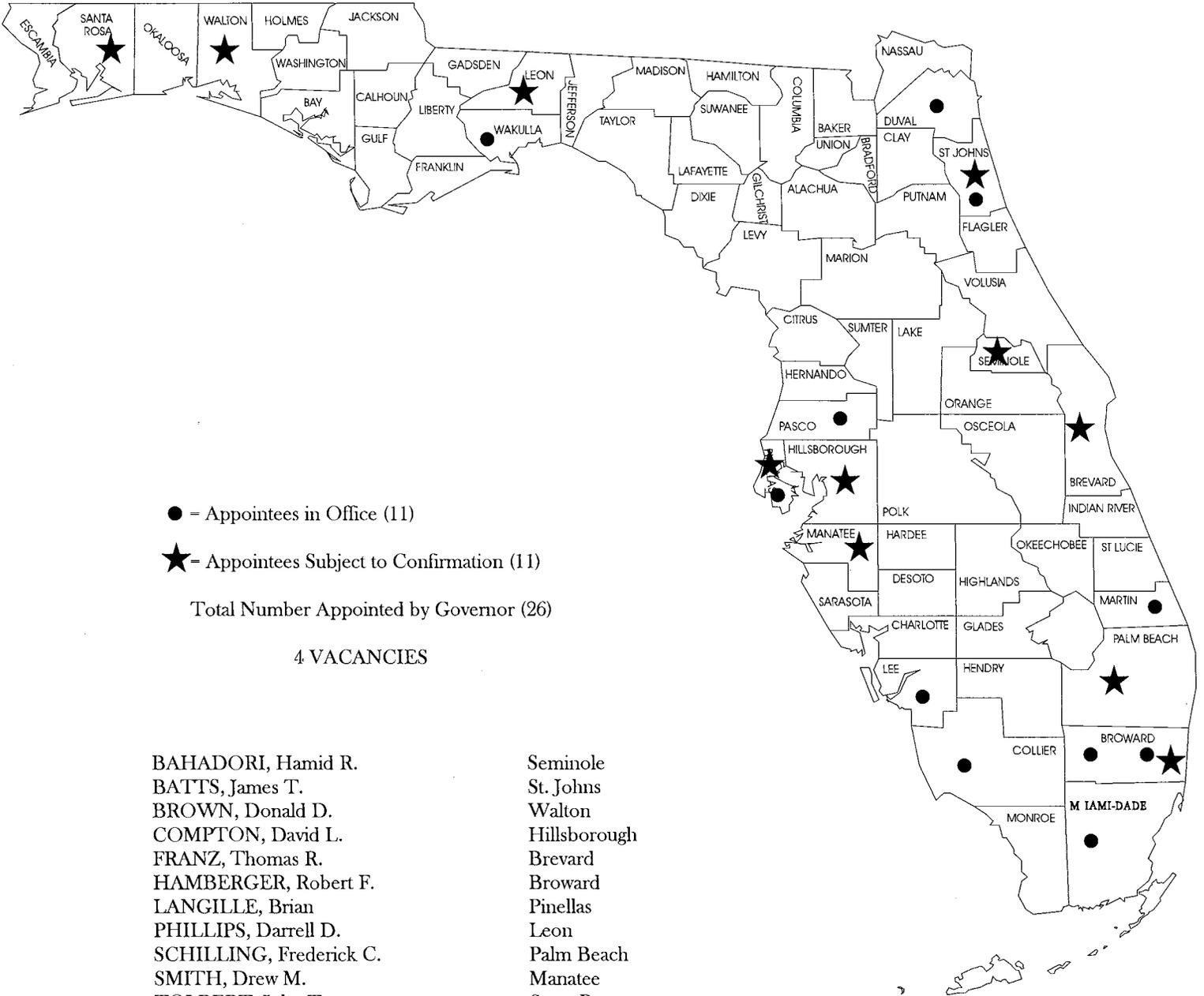

- One member who represents the Department of Financial Services;
- One member who is a county codes enforcement official;
- One member of a Florida-based organization of persons with disabilities or a nationally chartered organization of persons with disabilities with chapters in this state;
- One member of the manufactured buildings industry who is licensed to do business in this state and is actively engaged in the industry;
- One mechanical or electrical engineer registered to practice in this state and actively engaged in the profession;
- One member who is a representative of a municipality or a charter county;
- One member of the building products manufacturing industry who is authorized to do business in this state and actively engaged in the industry;
- One member who is a representative of the building owners and managers industry who is actively engaged in commercial building ownership or management;

I. Summary:

SB 486 expands the use of the Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB) to state/local ballot measures and judicial merit retention elections. The FWAB is a “ballot of last resort” for absent, active-duty military (and their families) and overseas citizens who timely request, but fail to receive, an official absentee ballot from their county supervisor of elections.

The bill takes effect on July 1, 2014.

II. Present Situation:

The Federal Write-in Absentee Ballot (FWAB) is a federally-mandated, alternative or “back-up” ballot that allows otherwise-eligible overseas citizens and absent active-duty military (and their families) to cast votes in federal elections,¹ *provided* they made a timely-request for a regular absentee ballot. Most states have also authorized the FWAB for voting in certain state and local elections.

In 2011, Florida expanded the FWAB’s use beyond just federal elections to include state and local elections **involving two or more candidates**.² At the time, the FWAB was designed *solely* for candidate races, with lines for designating candidates’ names and offices sought; it did not contemplate ballot elections requiring a voter’s affirmation or rejection. In August 2013, the federal government modified the FWAB form and to specifically include spaces for “Ballot Initiatives” and the “Initiative Vote.”³

The bill eliminates Florida's "multi-candidate restriction," and authorizes the FWAB as a "ballot of last resort"⁴ for eligible voters in all federal, state, and local elections — including statewide constitutional initiatives/local ballot measures and judicial merit retention elections for the Florida Supreme Court and district courts of appeal. It specifically directs that votes cast in judicial retention elections be treated in the same manner as ballot measures requiring a "yes" or "no" vote. Finally, it requires the Department of State to adopt rules prescribing what markings, symbols, or language on the FWAB constitute a valid vote with regard to ballot measures.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2014.

We believe non-election years are the best time to address election legislation, and urge you to refrain from making major changes to election administration in an election year. However, there are a few targeted priority items we would ask the legislature to address this session.

There are two “technical corrections” to the 2013 legislation we would like to see revisited.

First, language regarding when a voter can “cure” their unsigned absentee ballot, a new provision in the law which we supported, says that a voter has until the Monday before Election Day to do so. However, a companion section that includes specific verbiage for affidavit instructions to the voter is inconsistent. It is a very simple fix, of which committee staff and the Division of Elections are both aware.

Second, last session you adopted a provision to allow for a voter to opt-in to receiving their sample ballot via e-mail rather than through the mail, a proposal we advocated. In doing so, the legislature removed four key words: “in lieu of publication.” This will result in a significant added cost for those of us who choose to send sample ballots directly to voters, but will now be required to also publish a sample ballot. This was previously an either/or option and runs counter to the intent of the bill, which was to reduce costs to taxpayers while providing a more efficient delivery system for sample ballots.

Additionally, we as supervisors of elections are concerned with protecting the privacy of our voters.

You passed legislation last session to protect from public disclosure voters’ e-mail addresses we gather for voter registration purposes, a common sense provision which garnered only one “no” vote in each chamber. Unfortunately, Governor Scott vetoed the bill. We urge the legislature to once again pass this bill and we look forward to persuading Governor Scott to support this popular measure on its merits.

Another way in which we believe the privacy of our voters should be protected is by ending the practice of making their full date of birth available for public disclosure. We are concerned with the amount of personal information publicly available on 12 million Florida voters through the Florida Voter Registration System. While much of the information is necessary and appropriate for public disclosure, a full date of birth is neither necessary nor appropriate. For instance, a voter's date of birth can be used to request an absentee ballot. The age of a voter can be made publicly available for demographic purposes while protecting voters' privacy.

[These changes clarify the Commission's jurisdiction over Section 105.071, and the penalties for a violation of the section.]

105.071 Candidates for judicial office; limitations on political activity.—A candidate for judicial office shall not:

- (1) Participate in any partisan political party activities, except that such candidate may register to vote as a member of any political party and may vote in any party primary for candidates for nomination of the party in which she or he is registered to vote.
- (2) Campaign as a member of any political party.
- (3) Publicly represent or advertise herself or himself as a member of any political party.
- (4) Endorse any candidate.
- (5) Make political speeches other than in the candidate's own behalf.
- (6) Make contributions to political party funds.
- (7) Accept contributions from any political party.
- (8) Solicit contributions for any political party.
- (9) Accept or retain a place on any political party committee.
- (10) Make ~~any~~ a contribution to any person, group, or organization for its endorsement to judicial office.
- (11) Agree to pay all or any part of any advertisement sponsored by any person, group, or organization wherein the candidate may be endorsed for judicial office by any such person, group or organization.

A candidate for judicial office or retention therein, who violates the provisions of this section is liable for a civil fine ~~of up to~~ not to exceed \$1,000 per count ~~to be determined by the Florida Elections Commission~~ pursuant to s.106.265.

106.25 Reports of alleged violations to Florida Elections Commission; disposition of findings.

- (1) Jurisdiction to investigate and determine violations of this chapter, s. 105.071, and chapter 104 is vested in the Florida Elections Commission; however, nothing in this section limits the jurisdiction of any other officers or agencies of government empowered by law to investigate, act upon, or dispose of alleged violations of this code.
- (2) The commission shall investigate all violations of this chapter, s. 105.071, and chapter 104, but only after having received either a sworn complaint or information reported to it under this subsection by the Division of Elections. Such sworn complaint must be based upon personal information or information other than hearsay. Any person, other than the division, having information of any violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104 shall file a sworn complaint with the commission. The commission shall investigate only those alleged violations specifically contained within the sworn complaint. If any complainant fails to allege all

violations that arise from the facts or allegations alleged in a complaint, the commission shall be barred from investigating a subsequent complaint from such complainant that is based upon such facts or allegations that were raised or could have been raised in the first complaint. If the complaint includes allegations of violations relating to expense items reimbursed by a candidate, committee, or organization to the campaign account before a sworn complaint is filed, the commission shall be barred from investigating such allegations. Such sworn complaint shall state whether a complaint of the same violation has been made to any state attorney. Within 5 days after receipt of a sworn complaint, the commission shall transmit a copy of the complaint to the alleged violator. The respondent shall have 14 days after receipt of the complaint to file an initial response, and the executive director may not determine the legal sufficiency of the complaint during that time period. If the executive director finds that the complaint is legally sufficient, the respondent shall be notified of such finding by letter, which sets forth the statutory provisions alleged to have been violated and the alleged factual basis that supports the finding. All sworn complaints alleging violations of the Florida Election Code over which the commission has jurisdiction shall be filed with the commission within 2 years after the alleged violations. The period of limitations is tolled on the day a sworn complaint is filed with the commission. The complainant may withdraw the sworn complaint at any time prior to a probable cause hearing if good cause is shown. Withdrawal shall be requested in writing, signed by the complainant, and witnessed by a notary public, stating the facts and circumstances constituting good cause. The executive director shall prepare a written recommendation regarding disposition of the request which shall be given to the commission together with the request. "Good cause" shall be determined based upon the legal sufficiency or insufficiency of the complaint to allege a violation and the reasons given by the complainant for wishing to withdraw the complaint. If withdrawal is permitted, the commission must close the investigation and the case. No further action may be taken. The complaint will become a public record at the time of withdrawal.

(3) For the purposes of commission jurisdiction, a violation shall mean the willful performance of an act prohibited by this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104 or the willful failure to perform an act required by this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104. The commission may not by rule determine what constitutes willfulness or further define the term "willful" for purposes of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104. Willfulness is a determination of fact; however, at the request of the respondent at any time after probable cause is found, willfulness may be considered and determined in an informal hearing before the commission.

(4) The commission shall undertake a preliminary investigation to determine if the facts alleged in a sworn complaint or a matter initiated by the division constitute probable cause to believe that a violation has occurred.

(a) When the investigator's report is completed, the executive director shall notify the respondent that the report is completed and shall send to the respondent a copy of the investigator's report. The investigatory file and main complaint file shall be open for inspection by the respondent and the respondent's counsel at that time, and copies may be obtained at no more than cost.

(b) The respondent shall be given not less than 14 days from the date of mailing of the investigator's report to file with the commission a written response to the investigator's report. This time period may be shortened with the consent of the respondent, or without the consent of the respondent when the passage of time could reasonably be expected to render moot the ultimate disposition of the matter by the commission so long as reasonable notice under the circumstances is given.

(c) Counsel for the commission shall review the investigator's report and shall make a written recommendation to the commission for the disposition of the complaint. If the counsel for the commission recommends that the commission find probable cause, the recommendation shall include a statement of what charges shall be at issue. A copy of the recommendation shall be furnished to the respondent. The respondent shall be given not less than 14 days from the date of mailing of the recommendation of counsel for the commission to file with the commission a written response to the recommendation. This time period may be shortened with the consent of the respondent, or without the consent of the respondent when the passage of time could reasonably be expected to render moot the ultimate disposition of the matter by the commission, so long as the recommendation is furnished to the respondent within a reasonable period of time under the circumstances.

(d) The respondent and each complainant, their counsel, and the counsel for the commission shall be permitted to attend the hearing at which the probable cause determination is made. Notice of the hearing shall be sent to the respondent, each complainant, and counsel for the commission at least 14 days before the hearing. This time period may be shortened with the consent of the respondent, or without the consent of the respondent when the passage of time could reasonably be expected to render moot the ultimate disposition of the matter by the commission, so long as the notice is furnished within a reasonable period of time under the circumstances.

(e) The probable cause determination is the conclusion of the preliminary investigation. The respondent and the counsel for the commission shall be permitted to make brief oral statements in the nature of oral argument to the commission, based on the investigator's report, before the probable cause determination. The commission's determination shall be based upon the investigator's report, the recommendation of counsel for the commission, the complaint, and staff recommendations, as well as any written statements submitted by the respondent and any oral statements made at the hearing. No testimony or other evidence will be accepted at the hearing.

(f) At its meeting to determine probable cause, the commission may continue its determination to allow further investigation; may order the issuance of a public report of its investigation if it finds no probable cause to believe that there has been a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104, concluding the matter before it; may order a final, public hearing of the complaint if it finds probable cause to believe that there has been a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104; or may take such other action as it deems necessary to resolve the complaint, consistent with due process of law. In making its determination, the commission may consider:

1. The sufficiency of the evidence against the respondent, as contained in the investigator's report;
2. The admissions and other stipulations of the respondent, if any;
3. The nature and circumstances of the respondent's actions;
4. The expense of further proceedings; and
5. Such other factors as it deems material to its decision.

If the commission finds probable cause, the commission shall determine what charges shall be at issue.

(g) If no probable cause is found, the commission shall dismiss the case and the case shall become a matter of public record, except as otherwise provided in this section, together with a written statement of the findings of the preliminary investigation and a summary of the facts which the commission shall send to the complainant and the alleged violator. A finding of no

probable cause by the commission is a full adjudication of all such matters. The commission may not charge a respondent in a subsequent complaint alleging violations based upon the same actions, non actions, or circumstances wherein the commission found no probable cause.

(h) If probable cause is found, the commission shall so notify the complainant and the alleged violator in writing. All documents made or received in the disposition of the complaint shall become public records upon a finding by the commission.

(i)1. Upon a commission finding of probable cause, the counsel for the commission shall attempt to reach a consent agreement with the respondent. At any time, the commission may enter into a consent order with a respondent without requiring the respondent to admit to a violation of law within the jurisdiction of the commission.

2. A consent agreement is not binding upon either party unless and until it is signed by the respondent and by counsel for the commission upon approval by the commission.

3. Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the commission from entering into a consent agreement with a respondent prior to a commission finding of probable cause if a respondent indicates in writing a desire to enter into negotiations directed towards reaching such a consent agreement. Any consent agreement reached under this subparagraph is subject to the provisions of subparagraph 2. and shall have the same force and effect as a consent agreement reached after the ~~commission~~ commission's finding of probable cause.

(j) If a consent agreement is reached between the commission and the respondent, counsel for the commission shall send a copy of the signed agreement to both complainant and respondent.

In a case where probable cause is found, the commission shall make a preliminary determination to consider the matter or to refer the matter to the state attorney for the judicial circuit in which the alleged violation occurred. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, the commission may, at its discretion, dismiss any complaint at any stage of disposition if it determines that the public interest would not be served by proceeding further, in which case the commission shall issue a public report stating with particularity its reasons for the dismissal.

(5) A person alleged by the Elections Commission to have committed a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104 may elect, as a matter of right, within 30 days after the date of the filing of the commission's allegations, to have a formal administrative hearing conducted by an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings. The administrative law judge in such proceedings shall enter a final order, which may include the imposition of civil penalties, subject to appeal as provided in s.120.68. If the person does not elect to have a hearing by an administrative law judge and does not elect to resolve the complaint by a consent order, the person is entitled to a formal or informal hearing conducted before the commission.

(6) It is the duty of a state attorney receiving a complaint referred by the commission to investigate the complaint promptly and thoroughly; to undertake such criminal or civil actions as are justified by law; and to report to the commission the results of such investigation, the action taken, and the disposition thereof. The failure or refusal of a state attorney to prosecute or to initiate action upon a complaint or a referral by the commission shall not bar further action by the commission under this chapter.

(7) Every sworn complaint filed pursuant to this chapter with the commission, every investigation and investigative report or other paper of the commission with respect to a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104, and every proceeding of the commission with respect to a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104 is confidential, is exempt from the provisions of ss. 119.07(1) and 286.011, and is exempt from publication in the Florida

Administrative Weekly of any notice or agenda with respect to any proceeding relating to such violation, except under the following circumstances:

- (a) As provided in subsection (6);
- (b) Upon a determination of probable cause or no probable cause by the commission; or
- (c) For proceedings conducted with respect to appeals of fines levied by filing officers for the late filing of reports required by this chapter.

However, a complainant is not bound by the confidentiality provisions of this section. In addition, confidentiality may be waived in writing by the person against whom the complaint has been filed or against whom the investigation has been initiated. If a finding of probable cause in a case is entered within 30 days prior to the date of the election with respect to which the alleged violation occurred, such finding and the proceedings and records relating to such case shall not become public until noon of the day following such election. When two or more persons are being investigated by the commission with respect to an alleged violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104, the commission may not publicly enter a finding of probable cause or no probable cause in the case until a finding of probable cause or no probable cause for the entire case has been determined. However, once the confidentiality of any case has been breached, the person or persons under investigation have the right to waive the confidentiality of the case, thereby opening up the proceedings and records to the public. Any person who discloses any information

or matter made confidential by the provisions of this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(8) Any person who files a complaint pursuant to this section while knowing that the allegations contained in such complaint are false or without merit commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

(9) The commission shall maintain a database of all final orders and agency actions. Such database shall be available to the public and shall be maintained in such a manner as to be searchable, at a minimum, by issue, statutes, individuals, or entities referenced.

106.265 Civil penalties. --

(1) The commission or, in cases referred to the Division of Administrative Hearings pursuant to s. 106.25(5), the administrative law judge is authorized upon the finding of a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104 to impose civil penalties in the form of fines not to exceed \$1,000 per count, or, if applicable, to impose a civil penalty as provided in s. 104.271 or s. 106.19.

(2) In determining the amount of such civil penalties, the commission or administrative law judge shall consider, among other mitigating and aggravating circumstances:

- (a) The gravity of the act or omission;
- (b) Any previous history of similar acts or omissions;
- (c) The appropriateness of such penalty to the financial resources of the person, political committee, committee of continuous existence, affiliated party committee, electioneering communications organization, or political party; and
- (d) Whether the person, political committee, committee of continuous existence, affiliated party committee, electioneering communications organization, or political party has shown good faith in attempting to comply with the provisions of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104.

(3) If any person, political committee, committee of continuous existence, affiliated party committee, electioneering communications organization, or political party fails or refuses to pay to the commission any civil penalties assessed pursuant to the provisions of this section, the commission shall be responsible for collecting the civil penalties resulting from such action.

(4) Any civil penalty collected pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

(5) Any fine assessed pursuant to this chapter shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

(6) In any case in which the commission determines that a person has filed a complaint against another person with a malicious intent to injure the reputation of the person complained against by filing the complaint with knowledge that the complaint contains one or more false allegations or with reckless disregard for whether the complaint contains false allegations of fact material to a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104, the complainant shall be liable for costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in the defense of the person complained against, including the costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in proving entitlement to and the amount of costs and fees. If the complainant fails to pay such costs and fees voluntarily within 30 days following such finding by the commission, the commission shall forward such information to the Department of Legal Affairs, which shall bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction to recover the amount of such costs and fees awarded by the commission.

2. Service of Process

[Currently, the Commission uses the following delivery methods for documents that are statutorily required to be provided to respondents:

- *Certified mail without a return receipt to transmit the complaint;*
- *Certified mail without a return receipt to transmit the legal sufficiency determination;*
- *Regular mail to transmit the Report of Investigation;*
- *Regular mail to transmit the Staff Recommendation;*
- *Regular mail for Notices of Hearing;*
- *Certified mail with a return receipt to provide notice of a finding of probable cause; and*
- *Certified mail with a return receipt to transmit a final order that imposes a fine.*

Certified mail without a return receipt currently costs \$3.10 in addition to postage; certified mail with a return receipt costs \$5.65 in addition to postage.

Cases are often delayed because a respondent does not notify the filing officer or the Commission of a changed address. In many cases, staff must resort to process servers to hand deliver documents to respondents in order to move a case forward. These proposed changes would require the respondent to keep a current mailing address on file with the filing officer until the statute of limitations has run, and on file with the Commission once an investigation is opened. In addition, the changes would clarify the delivery methods the Commission can rely upon to effectuate “good service” of documents throughout a case. The changes will result in more efficient disposition of cases, as well as a savings to the Commission.]

106.141 Disposition of surplus funds by candidates.

(11) Any candidate required to dispose of funds pursuant to this section shall notify the officer with whom reports are required to be filed pursuant to s. 106.07 of any change of mailing address occurring within two years of the date on which the last report required by this chapter is due. Failure to notify the filing officer of such change of mailing address constitutes a violation of this chapter and, notwithstanding s. 106.25(2), a complaint may be amended at any time during the pendency of a case to include this violation.

(5) A person alleged by the Elections Commission to have committed a violation of this chapter, or chapter 104 may elect, as a matter of right, within 30 days after the date of the filing of the commission's allegations, to have a formal administrative hearing conducted by an administrative law judge in the Division of Administrative Hearings. The administrative law judge in such proceedings shall enter a final order, which may include the imposition of civil penalties, subject to appeal as provided in s. 120.68. If the person does not elect to have a hearing by an administrative law judge and does not elect to resolve the complaint by a consent order, the person is entitled to a formal or informal hearing conducted before the commission.

(6) Upon determining whether the respondent committed a violation of this chapter, s. 105.071, or chapter 104, the commission shall notify the respondent of its decision. Notice is deemed complete upon mailing of the order to the mailing address on record with the commission or to the electronic mailing address if the respondent has consented to receive documents electronically.

~~(6)~~(7) It is the duty of a state attorney receiving a complaint referred by the commission to investigate the complaint promptly and thoroughly; to undertake such criminal or civil actions as are justified by law; and to report to the commission the results of such investigation, the action taken, and the disposition thereof. The failure or refusal of a state attorney to prosecute or to initiate action upon a complaint or a referral by the commission shall not bar further action by the commission under this chapter.

~~(7)~~(8) Every sworn complaint filed pursuant to this chapter with the commission, every investigation and investigative report or other paper of the commission with respect to a violation of this chapter or chapter 104, and every proceeding of the commission with respect to a violation of this chapter or chapter 104 is confidential, is exempt from the provisions of ss. 119.07(1) and 286.011, and is exempt from publication in the Florida Administrative Weekly of any notice or agenda with respect to any proceeding relating to such violation, except under the following circumstances:

(a) As provided in subsection ~~(6)~~(7);

(b) Upon a determination of probable cause or no probable cause by the commission; or

(c) For proceedings conducted with respect to appeals of fines levied by filing officers for the late filing of reports required by this chapter.

However, a complainant is not bound by the confidentiality provisions of this section. In addition, confidentiality may be waived in writing by the person against whom the complaint has been filed or against whom the investigation has been initiated. If a finding of probable cause in a case is entered within 30 days prior to the date of the election with respect to which the alleged

violation occurred, such finding and the proceedings and records relating to such case shall not become public until noon of the day following such election. When two or more persons are being investigated by the commission with respect to an alleged violation of this chapter or chapter 104, the commission may not publicly enter a finding of probable cause or no probable cause in the case until a finding of probable cause or no probable cause for the entire case has been determined. However, once the confidentiality of any case has been breached, the person or persons under investigation have the right to waive the confidentiality of the case, thereby opening up the proceedings and records to the public. Any person who discloses any information or matter made confidential by the provisions of this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

~~(8)~~(9) Any person who files a complaint pursuant to this section while knowing that the allegations contained in such complaint are false or without merit commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

~~(9)~~(10) The commission shall maintain a database of all final orders and agency actions. Such database shall be available to the public and shall be maintained in such a manner as to be searchable, at a minimum, by issue, statutes, individuals, or entities referenced.

3. Unpaid Fines-Wage Garnishment

[When a Respondent is found to have violated Florida's elections laws, FEC enters a Final Order against the Respondent, setting the statutorily authorized, civil penalty for the violation. In many cases, Respondents do not comply with the Final Orders. While FEC files enforcement actions against non-compliant Respondents, collection efforts are often unsuccessful.]

This proposal is to amend the FEC statute with language almost identical to that passed for the Commission on Ethics last year, specifically allowing the Commission to record its final orders as judgments and seek garnishment of wages as an enforcement mechanism.

All monies from fines are deposited into General Revenue.]

106.265 Civil penalties.—

(1) The commission or, in cases referred to the Division of Administrative Hearings pursuant to s. 106.25(5), the administrative law judge is authorized upon the finding of a violation of this chapter or chapter 104 to impose civil penalties in the form of fines not to exceed \$1,000 per count, or, if applicable, to impose a civil penalty as provided in s. 104.271 or s. 106.19.

(2) In determining the amount of such civil penalties, the commission or administrative law judge shall consider, among other mitigating and aggravating circumstances:

- (a) The gravity of the act or omission;
- (b) Any previous history of similar acts or omissions;
- (c) The appropriateness of such penalty to the financial resources of the person, political committee, affiliated party committee, electioneering communications organization, or political party; and
- (d) Whether the person, political committee, affiliated party committee, electioneering communications organization, or political party has shown good faith in attempting to comply with the provisions of this chapter or chapter 104.

(3) ~~If any person, political committee, affiliated party committee, electioneering communications organization, or political party fails or refuses to pay to the commission any civil penalties assessed pursuant to the provisions of this section, the commission shall be responsible for collecting the civil penalties resulting from such action.~~ Notwithstanding any provision of chapter 120, any fine imposed under this subsection which is not waived by final order of the commission and which remains unpaid more than 60 days after the notice of payment due or more than 60 days after the commission renders a final order on the appeal must be submitted to the Department of Financial Services as a claim, debt, or other obligation owed to the state, and the department shall assign the collection of such fine to a collection agent as provided in s. 17.20.

(4) Before referring any unpaid fine accrued pursuant to this section to the Department of Financial Services, the commission shall attempt to determine whether the individual owing such a fine is a current public officer or current public employee. If so, the commission may notify the Chief Financial Officer or the governing body of the appropriate county, municipality, or special district of the total amount of any fine owed to the commission by such individual.

(a) After receipt and verification of the notice from the commission, the Chief Financial Officer or the governing body of the county, municipality, or special district shall begin withholding the lesser of 10 percent or the maximum amount allowed under federal law from any salary-related payment. The withheld payments shall be remitted to the commission until the fine is satisfied.

(b) The Chief Financial Officer or the governing body of the county, municipality, or special district may retain an amount of each withheld payment, as provided in s. 77.0305, to cover the administrative costs incurred under this section.

(5) If the commission determines that the individual who is the subject of an unpaid fine is no longer a public officer or public employee or if the commission is unable to determine whether the individual is a current public officer or public employee, the commission may, 6 months after the order becomes final, seek garnishment of any wages to satisfy the amount of the fine, or any unpaid portion thereof, pursuant to chapter 77. Upon recording the order imposing the fine with the clerk of the circuit court, the order shall be deemed a judgment for purposes of garnishment pursuant to chapter 77.

(6) The commission may refer unpaid fines to the appropriate collection agency, as directed by the Chief Financial Officer, to utilize any collection methods provided by law. Except as expressly limited by this section, any other collection methods authorized by law are allowed.

(7) Action may be taken to collect any unpaid fine imposed by this section within 20 years after the date the final order is rendered.

~~(4)~~ (8) Any civil penalty collected pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

~~(5)~~ (9) Any fine assessed pursuant to this chapter shall be deposited into the General Revenue Fund.

~~(6)~~ (10) In any case in which the commission determines that a person has filed a complaint against another person with a malicious intent to injure the reputation of the person complained against by filing the complaint with knowledge that the complaint contains one or more false allegations or with reckless disregard for whether the complaint contains false allegations of fact material to a violation of this chapter or chapter 104, the complainant shall be liable for costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in the defense of the person complained against, including the costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in proving entitlement to and the amount of costs and fees. If the complainant fails to pay such costs and fees voluntarily within 30 days following such finding by the commission, the commission shall forward such information to the Department of Legal Affairs, which shall bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction to recover the amount of such costs and fees awarded by the commission.

About Our Agency: History

- In 1951, the Legislature revised the Florida Election Code and added the requirement that candidates file reports listing all contributions received and expenditures made by their campaigns and that they make all expenditures from their campaign accounts. This legislation is often referred to as the "**Who Gave It Who Got It**" law.
- In 1973, the Legislature passed what is now Chapter 106, Florida Statutes, and created the Florida Elections Commission to enforce campaign financing provisions.
- In 1998, the Legislature delegated to the Commission the responsibility to enforce the provisions of Chapter 104, Florida Statutes.

About Our Agency: Composition of the Commission

- Composed of nine members appointed by the Governor

- The Chair serves for a maximum of four years with his or her term running concurrently with the term of the appointing Governor
- The members of the Commission may serve no more than two full terms of four years
- Commissioners shall not be a member of any county, state, or national committee of a political party; an officer in any partisan political club, or organization; or hold, or be a candidate for, any other public office
- No person is eligible for appointment to the Commission if they held an elected office in the year immediately preceding their appointment
- No more than five Commissioners can be from the same political party at any one time

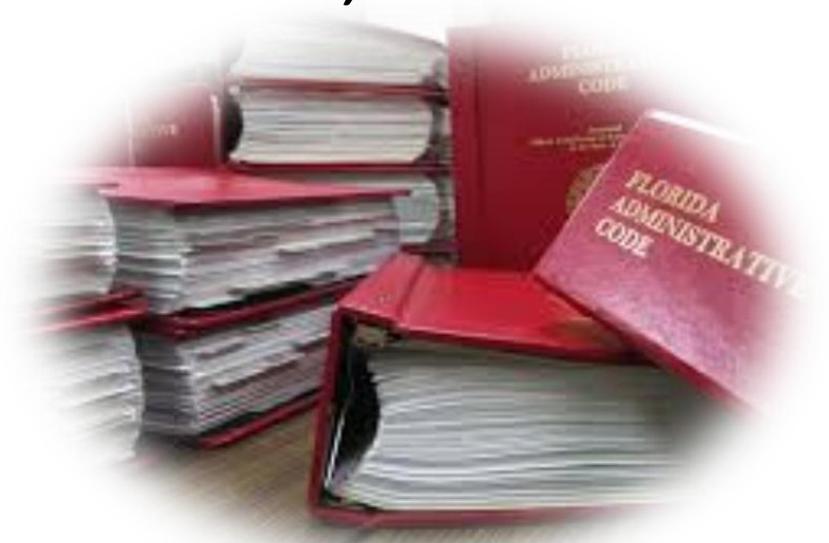

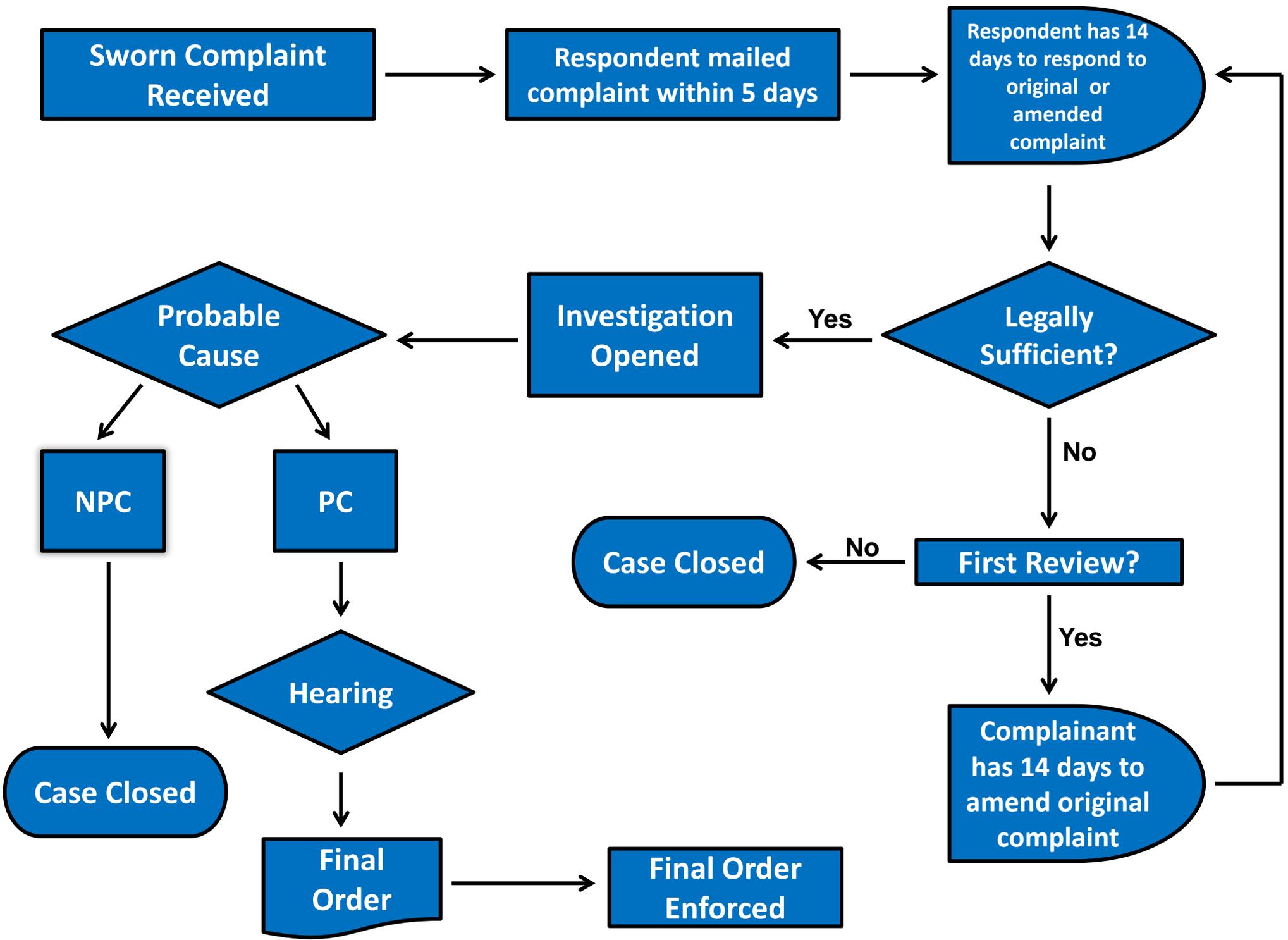

The Complaint Process

- Complaints must meet the following criteria in order to be considered legally sufficient:
 - The complaint alleges a violation of Chapter 104 or 106 or Section 105.071, Florida Statutes;
 - The complaint was made under oath in the presence of a notary public or other person authorized by law to administer oaths;
 - The complaint contains the original signature of the complainant;
 - The complaint contains specific facts upon which the complainant bases the allegation of a violation of law; and
 - The complaint alleges a violation that occurred within two years of the date the complaint is filed with the Commission.

The Commission will not accept faxed complaints because an original signature is required.



Commission Meetings

- The Commission meets and hears cases four times per year:
 - February
 - May
 - August
 - November



Civil Penalties

- Section 106.265, Florida Statutes, authorizes the Commission to impose a fine not to exceed \$1,000 per violation
- There are also several enhanced penalty provisions in Chapter 106, Florida Statutes
- All civil penalties collected by the Commission are deposited into the General Revenue Fund
- All consent order agreements approved by the Commission are deposited into the General Revenue Fund

Common Violations

Chapter 104, Florida Statutes

There are over 60 separate violations

- Prohibiting a person from **falsely swearing an oath** in connection with or arising out of voting or elections. §104.011, F.S.
- Prohibiting a person from giving or promising anything of value to a person intending to **buy that person's vote**. §104.061, F.S.
- Prohibiting a **candidate from giving**, paying, expending, or contributing any money or other **thing of value to any other candidate**. §104.071, F.S.

Common Violations

Chapter 104, Florida Statutes

- Prohibiting a person who knows that he is **not a qualified elector** from voting in any election. §104.15, F.S.
- Prohibiting a candidate from **falsely and maliciously charging that an opposing candidate violated** a provision of the Florida Election Code. §104.271(1), F.S.
- Prohibiting a candidate from making **false factual statements with malice** about an opposing candidate. §104.271(2), F.S.

Common Violations

Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

There are almost 100 separate violations

- Prohibiting a candidate or political committee from **accepting contributions or making expenditures prior to appointing a campaign treasurer** and designating a campaign depository. §106.021(1)(a), F.S.
- Failure of a political committee to **file a statement of organization**. §106.03(1), F.S.
- Failure of the treasurer of a candidate or political committee to **file regular reports** of all contributions received, and all expenditures made, by or on behalf of the candidate or political committee. §106.07(1), F.S.
- Prohibiting a campaign treasurer, candidate, or political committee chair from **certifying a campaign treasurer's report as true, correct, and complete** when it is not. §106.07(5), F.S.

Common Violations

Chapter 106, Florida Statutes

- Prohibiting a person or political committee from making **excessive contributions** to a candidate or political committee. §106.08(1)(a), F.S.
- Failure of a person to prominently mark all political advertisements with a **proper political disclaimer**. §106.143, F.S.
- Prohibiting the **expenditure of campaign funds that have already been obligated**. §106.11(4), F.S.

Appeal Hearings

Automatic Fines

Candidates, political committees, and political parties that fail to file reports required by Chapter 106, F.S., are automatically assessed a fine by their respective filing officers.

The candidate or the chair of a political committee or political party may appeal or dispute the “auto-fine” and may request a hearing before the Commission. §§106.07(8)(c), 106.29(3)(a)F.S.

The Commission decides if:

- (1) The report was in fact **timely filed**;
- (2) There were **no unusual circumstances** and the fine should be upheld; or
- (3) There were **unusual circumstances** and the fine should be reduced or waived.

2013 Legislation

- Increased reporting will result in increased number of cases filed against candidates, political committees, and ECOs that fail to file timely, proper reports.
- FEC was appropriated one FTE position to account for increased workload; position has been filled.

2014 Legislative Proposals

Judicial Candidates

- Intended to clarify the Commission's jurisdiction over §105.071, F.S., relating to **candidates for judicial office**.
- Section 105.071(11), F.S., charges the Commission with the enforcement of §105.071, F.S., which delineates limitations on political activities by judicial candidates.
- However, the language in §106.25, F.S., which is the provision that specifically addresses the Commission's jurisdiction, does not include §105.071, F.S.
- Case came before the FEC in which a judicial candidate improperly represented himself as a member of a political party, but the Commission was unable to hear the case after this statutory inconsistency was argued.
- This proposal is intended to clarify that the Commission does have jurisdiction over §105.071 cases by adding a reference to the section throughout Chapter 106.

2014 Legislative Proposals

Service of Process

- Efficiency and cost-savings measure.
- Currently, staff uses certified and regular mail to provide Respondents with case-related material, as required by statute.
- Cases are often delayed because a Respondent does not notify the filing officer or the Commission of a changed address. In many cases, staff must resort to process servers to hand deliver documents to respondents in order to move a case forward.
- This proposal:
 - requires a Respondent to keep a **current mailing address** on file
 - makes it a **violation of the election code to fail to keep an address current** as required and allows the Commission to amend a complaint during the pendency of a case to include **ONLY** this violation
 - clarifies the **delivery methods** the Commission can rely upon to effectuate “good service” of documents throughout a case
 - allows service/transmission of documents **via email** if Respondent agrees

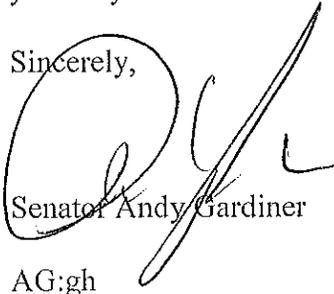
