

Towards the end of July, we held another Constituent Day where I met with many members of our community. These meetings are a productive time to learn about new issues and to discuss ways in which we can work towards positive solutions. I also was briefed by a number of organizations on their individual policy and appropriation goals for 2020.

As you make preparations for the upcoming school year, be reminded that Friday, August 2nd through Tuesday, August 6th will be the annual sales tax holiday. Certain school supplies such as pencils, calculators and notebooks selling for \$15 or less per item are exempt from sales tax along with certain clothing and accessories such as pants, belts and uniforms selling for \$60 or less per item. Additionally, computers and accessories selling for \$1,000 or less are part of the exemption. Take advantage of the various sales and specials many retail stores are having and stock up on your needs for the school year. Lastly, a sensitive topic for some, is that of food insecurity. My office attended an event with Agriculture Commissioner Nikki Fried in July to hear what is being done in our county to combat this issue. If you, a family member, friend or neighbor needs assistance, Feeding South Florida has a food pantry located at 4925 Park Ridge Blvd. in Boynton Beach. Free assistance to all is available between the hours of 8:00am-5:00pm Monday through Friday.

As a reminder, texting while driving became a primary offense on July 1. The ban on handheld use in school and work zones will be enforced starting October 1. Be mindful as school buses are back on the road and of children who will be using our public walkways to get to and from school.
