The goal of the Technology Education Model Project (TEMP) is to raise STEM education productivity and quality. We will do this by re-inventing STEM education methods in 4 areas: 1. Use open-source concepts that have been successful in the software world to capture and disseminate the intellectual property used by instructors; 2.Turn that instructional IP into a core curriculum that can be shared with other universities; 3. Imbed early career discovery into that core curriculum so students have early, accurate knowledge of the real world of work in STEM jobs; and 4. Build the total engineer, using methods from the military and athletics, to inculcate leadership, self-motivation and teamwork in students.
