11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Previously, the City designed & permitted 5 new wastewater pumping stations to replace those that were beyond their useful life & at risk of frequent failures & sewage overflows. In 2015, 3 of the 5 pumping stations were constructed, but the remaining 2 were not due to rising construction costs & the City's budgetary limitations. The 2 remaining pumping stations to be constructed are located at a park very near to Eagle Lake, the City's namesake recreation area, & at an area directly adjacent to Lake McLeod, respectively. Both pumping stations' locations are in environmentally sensitive areas that would result in surface water contamination in the event of failure (sewage overflows) of the existing pumping stations. The funds are for the proposed two replacement pumping stations' construction and equipped with emergency generators to maintain operation during power outages. Benefits include the avoidance of possible sewage overflows and reduced City expenditures for maintenance.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

<u>The funds requested will be spent on construction of two wastewater pumping stations. The pumping stations will be equipped with emergency generators. Construction of the proposed project is expected to cost \$800,000 and will take approximately one year to complete.</u>

<u>Construction of two new wastewater pumping stations with emergency generators for to allow reliable means</u> of wastewater collection system transmission for treatment.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

<u>The citizens of the City of Eagle Lake will benefit from improved and more reliable wastewater pumping</u> <u>stations with emergency generators to maintain operation of the stations during power outages and reduction</u> <u>of City expenses for maintenance of the existing pumping stations, which will be removed as a part of the</u> <u>proposed project.</u>

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>The project will allow two of the City's wastewater pumping stations at risk of failure and without emergency</u> <u>generators to be replaced by two new modern and reliable wastewater pumping stations with emergency</u> <u>generators. Benefits to the public include reliable wastewater collection system operation with reduced</u> <u>maintenance costs to greatly reduce the possibility of wastewater overflows/spills, which would result in costly</u> <u>cleanup and possible agency fines. Successful construction and startup of the proposed two new pumping</u> <u>stations is the methodology by which this outcome would be measured.</u>
