1. **Title of Project:** City of Midway Phase 1 Sanitary Sewer System

4. **Project/Program Description:**

The purpose of the funding is to eliminate septic tanks, thereby reducing the amount of nitrogen entering the groundwater and improving the public health by reducing the number of bacteria entering surface water. The city received state funding during the 2017-18 fiscal year for phase one of the project. This part of the phase involves the design of a sewer system to provide sewer service to 35 homes in the Rustling Pines and Orion Pointe neighborhoods, along with a pump station. The force main from the pump station will go under Interstate 10 before tying into the Talquin Electric wastewater treatment plant. This community has and continues to experience severe septic tank issues, this project will serve as a catalyst to ending a more than a decade problem for this municipality. It also provides an opportunity for the city to address and correct possible environmental and health issues from the current system.
