a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

<u>Southwest Florida was among the most negatively impacted during the last recession, with unemployment</u> reaching nearly 20% in some parts of our service district. FSW is proposing this certification program as part of our effort to work with local partners to make the region more economically diverse. Increasing the number of residents with training in a high-skill, high-technology field is critical to that effort. A&P technicians can be employed in numerous fields beyond aircraft maintenance, such as manufacturing.

<u>Florida SouthWestern State College will administer the program of study necessary to complete the Federal</u> Aviation Administration (FAA) certifications to qualify as an A&P mechanic.

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>Citizens across the state can attend the public college offered Airframe & Power Plant certification program.</u> The program will produce FAA certified airframe & power plant technicians, establishing a qualified pool of high-skill, high-tech candidates capable of performing various manufacturing & quality-control functions in the aviation and other industries.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

<u>Florida SouthWestern expects between 50-100 annually will be eligible to attend the program. Target</u> population will represent the typical Florida College System student demographic, but especially be attractive to military veterans and persons already in a skilled workforce setting.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>The expected benefit will be an increase in the number of highly skilled workforce members in our service</u> region. Florida SouthWestern reports data to the Florida Department of Education on such metrics as graduation, retention, job placements, & entry level wages, which will all demonstrate the effectiveness of the program.
