With that in mind Guatemalan-Maya Center strives to keep students focused and engaged while at the site but also eager to attend the classes because at the Guatemalan-Maya Center students must attend regular school in order to attend the after school programs at the Guatemalan-Maya Center. We hope to reduce chronic absenteeism and engage students to deter future gang activity by keeping students engaged in our program.
