d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>The project will service individuals who want to understand how prepare a yearly, quarterly and monthly</u> budget; it will cover credit counseling and restoration, to individuals, as well as businesses. Many business owners have not been exposed to financial literacy. They don't know how to invest, save, prepare a statement or how to read it. They are not ready financially for the future. This program will help them make sound financial decisions for their daily, regular activities, as well as, during emergency/irregular times.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

<u>The project will include participants of three different groups: 40% are high school students 30% are college</u> students and 30% other adults who are opening small businesses.

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

<u>Financial education in general helps participants manage their finance better. One of our goals is to teach</u> other become financial coaches to help others. Participants will receive certificates after successfully taking courses and passing our tests designed to measure knowledge of the graduates. We will have beginning, intermediate and advanced courses on budgeting, cash flow management, and tax savings strategies.

What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract? In addition to penalties provided by the state of Florida for persons or entities who fail to deliver what was contracted, the willfully negligent contractors will be charged of fraud and will be prosecuted as such. Projects that are being late will be taken away from the responsible contractor and will be re-assigned to a better bidder. Each contractor will be held accountable for their work and will be regarded based on a low/poor, moderate and strong/satisfactory performance. Only satisfactorily performed contractors will be paid and will retain their positions. We will refund any funds that were misappropriated.
