a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Since the advent of Medicaid managed care, it has become even more difficult for rural community transportation coordinators to provide accessible transportation to non-Medicaid transportation disadvantaged citizens. This allocation of funding is to assist community transportation coordinators located in rural areas to increase access for persons with disabilities, older adults, and people with low income to health care, employment, education and other life-sustaining activities.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Utilizers of more accessible transportation disadvantaged services would see increased transportation options in rural communities, which are currently inadequate in much of rural Florida, especially for the transportation disadvantaged. The creation and preservation of more accessible transportation disadvantaged services for persons residing in rural communities will allow such persons to commute for health care, employment, education, shopping and other life-sustaining purposes which they otherwise would not have access to.

d. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

<u>Direct services include, but are not limited to, fixed route transit, transportation on demand, bus passes, van</u> service, medical transportation, etc. These services are for the transportation disadvantaged population to increase to vital life activities such as access to health care, shopping, education, employment, etc.

e. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

<u>The target population is the transportation disadvantaged population residing within the rural areas of the</u> <u>state. This includes the elderly, disabled, and low-income individuals. In Jan. 2014, the Univ. of S. FL Center for</u> <u>Urban Transportation Research published the study "Unmet and Latent Demand for Transportation</u> <u>Disadvantaged Services", prepared for Florida Commission for Transportation Disadvantaged. The study</u> <u>concluded 37% of FL was Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) and within that group there existed a "Critical</u> <u>Need" group of elderly, disabled, and low income citizens, making up 4% of Florida's population. Of this group,</u> <u>58% of "Critical Need" trips are unmet.</u>

f. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome



will be measured?

<u>The creation and preservation of more accessible transportation disadvantaged services for persons residing</u> in rural communities will allow such persons to commute for health care, employment, education, shopping and other life-sustaining purposes which they otherwise would not have access to. The Commission for Transportation Disadvantaged, through its oversight of community transportation coordinators, can measure this increased access to health care, employment, education, shopping and other life-sustaining activities which the transportation disadvantaged population would otherwise not have access to.

- g. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract? <u>This funding is for the third year of the special allocation, and the Commission for Transportation</u> <u>Disadvantaged has existing penalties and performance metrics for its community transportation coordinators.</u>
