To improve school academic performance, student behavior, health and achievement in under-performing schools and challenged communities using an evidence-based model.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Statewide Community Partnership School planning and implementation efforts in which services are provided to youth, their families, and the surrounding community on the school campus. Activities are unique to each school and community through an assessment, but typically address student achievement, access to health care, parental involvement, food insecurity and combatting poverty that impacts a child's ability to learn and succeed.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Services include integrated student supports; extended day tutoring, mentoring and enrichments; behavioral, medical, dental health services; food pantries, parent resources and empowerment.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served? Students and families of multiple Community Partnership Schools statewide. >10,000 students
