1. Title of Project: Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools Program

4. Project/Program Description:

\$250,000 request to expand Special Olympics Unified Champion Schools program to a total of 230 K-12 schools and 17 colleges throughout the State of Florida. The program brings young people with and without disabilities together to compete in athletic competitions, to engage in youth leadership and advocacy activities, to promote whole school engagement through activities that promote acceptance and inclusion of youth with disabilities, and to provide sports/play programs and opportunities for younger children with disabilities to improve physical, cognitive and social skills through the Youth Athletes program. There is both anecdotal and quantitative evidence that supports the effectiveness of the program in promoting inclusion of young people with disabilities in school activities and a reduction in harmful behavior such as bullying which results from lack of understanding and acceptance of individuals with disabilities.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The program promotes understanding and acceptance of young people with disabilities by their peers without disabilities. It improves self-confidence, social and motor skills, and improved fitness levels of young people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. By promoting understanding and acceptance, negative behaviors such as bullying are reduced.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Athletic competitions involving young people with and without disabilities; leadership and advocacy activities involving young people with and without disabilities; whole-school activities that engage the entire school to promote understanding and inclusion; sports/play activities to engage younger children with and without disabilities to establish inclusion as a norm at early age.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

K-12 and college students with and without disabilities. 340 individuals served via SO College Programs and for K-12 we project impacting a total of 311,864 students through Unified Sports initiatives and service projects. This represents an increase of roughly 50,000 students to be served by the additional appropriation and this amount is expected to increase by approximately 20% in subsequent years as well.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Increase understanding and acceptance of young people with intellectual and developmental disabilities in the school community. Improve self-confidence, social and motor skills, and physical fitness levels of young people with intellectual disabilities. Data will be maintained on participation rates along with periodic surveys of young people, parents, and school system personnel to measure attitudes and outcomes.

f. What are the suggested penalties that the contracting agency may consider in addition to its standard penalties for failing to meet deliverables or performance measures provided for in the contract?

Reduced payment with contract termination for persistent failure to maintain acceptable performance.
