1. Title of Project: Just Read, Florida! Literacy Matrix PD System

4. Project/Program Description:

Florida reading proficiency levels have stagnated in recent years, with far too many third graders not reading on grade level. Currently, just 57% of third graders are reading-proficient. This \$3.5M appropriation through the Just Read, Florida office will tackle this considerable dilemma, with a goal of significantly increasing the reading proficiency of third graders to the highest levels in Florida's history. This will be accomplished through the delivery of a literacy-focused, online professional development system, called the Literacy Matrix, that will ensure teachers know how to implement evidence-based reading instruction with additional intervention supports for struggling readers. The system has been developed based on approaches that have demonstrated significant impact on teacher practice and child outcomes and is poised to be scaled across the state to reach up to 2,000 teachers this year and positively impact thousands of students.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

This appropriation will fulfill 2017 Florida Statute (1001.215) mandating the development and delivery of a literacy-focused professional development system to ensure that they are able to effectively implement evidence-based reading instruction with even the most struggling readers. This system, called the Literacy Matrix, will support up to 2,000 teachers in 2019-2020 who need to complete their reading endorsement.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

The Literacy Matrix will be implemented by the UF Lastinger Center and will provide online, research-based professional development to up to 2,000 Florida K-2 educators who need to complete the state-mandated

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reading endorsement. Additional support will be offered through virtual learning communities and coaching opportunities to further enhance teacher knowledge around evidence-based reading instruction practices. A robust evaluation will be conducted by the Florida Center for Reading Research to examine the implementation and impact of the professional development system on teacher content knowledge, teacher practice, and student reading proficiency.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Online professional development, through the Literacy Matrix, that focuses on evidence-based, high-impact reading instruction techniques and strategies will be delivered to up to 2,000 K-2 teachers across the state of Florida at no cost to them, along with additional support through virtual communities of practice and coaching.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

 Up to 2,000 Florida K-2 teachers who must complete the state-mandated reading endorsement. In turn, these teachers serve approximately 30,000 students this year.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

As already demonstrated through pilot studies, the Literacy Matrix will significantly increase teacher knowledge on effective literacy instruction techniques, particularly those that help the most struggling readers. This will be evaluated by FCRR and measured through pre- and post-assessments within the Literacy Matrix. A long-term expected benefit is improved reading proficiency levels for third grade students, which will be measured in future years through FSA third grade reading assessments.
