As the only Florida state university dedicated exclusively to STEM degrees, Florida Polytechnic University seeks to attract Florida's most talented students and retain them in Florida jobs after graduation. These highly talented students often earn substantial Advanced Placement credit in high school. Florida Poly proposes to create a pathway for up to 100 students to complete their baccalaureate degree in three years. This pathway will require flexible scheduling and two internships, tying the program directly to Florida industry.

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The enhanced graduation pathway will reduce costs to students; increase degree completion in less than 4 years; provide an incentive for highly talented STEM students to earn their degree in Florida; and connect these students directly with Florida industry.

- b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?
  - The program will be structured with scheduling enhancements such as off-cycle, summer, and "May-mester" courses. Each student will be required to serve two internships to ensure the program is tied directly to industry.
- c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?
  - Students will be provided with a unique opportunity to earn a STEM degree in three years, saving up to one year of living and tuition expenses.
- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

  Up to 100 highly talented STEM students will be served.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Instead of leaving Florida to earn a STEM degree and working out of state after graduation, this approach will keep our best STEM students in-state, and connect them to internship opportunities with up to 200 Florida companies. Keeping this talent in-state will support Florida's economic growth in high skill/high wage STEM areas.
