- 1. Title of Project: City of Oakland Park Fire Station #9

- 4. Project/Program Description:

The project will consist of construction of a new 13,000 square foot Fire Station/Emergency Operations Center. The new modern facility will replace the existing Fire Station #9 and be constructed adjacent to the existing station location. The new structure will be designed and constructed to withstand Category 5 Hurricane winds. In addition to the first responders being stationed at the facility, the City's emergency operations center will be constructed as part of the facility. The City does not currently have an EOC facility able to withstand and provide safe operation during high speed wind events greater than a Category 3 storm.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The City will be able to provide more effective fire and emergency services to the community on a daily basis. In addition, first responders and emergency personnel, as well as City staff, will also be able to immediately respond and begin recovery efforts after a natural disaster.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Funding to complete the proposed projects will allow for an increase in fire rescue and emergency response capabilities. The project will also provide enhanced response and recovery after a natural disaster.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The residents, visitors and businesses of Oakland Park and surrounding communities will be provided firerescue and EMT services. In addition the community will receive government assistance before, during and after a natural disaster through the EOC.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The facility provides fire rescue and emergency services to 35% of the City of Oakland Park. The Station will benefit approximately 20,000 of the 44,500 residents and is located in the central mid-town district. The service area of the facility represents a densely populated and developed urban area. There are many critical facilities and other significant target hazard facilities that are served by Station 9 including public schools, medical facilities, transportation routes and industries that deal with hazardous materials.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The expected outcome of the project is enhanced emergency services and disaster recovery. The completion of the structure will increase response times for Fire and EMT services. The new EOC represents a fully functional facility that will provide continuity and immediate responses after a disaster. Outcomes will be measured by response times compiled by the City and through the protection of property and life after a disaster occurs.
