Fire Suppression, ALS transport ambulance services, Public Education and Fire Safety programs, Fire Inspection and Fire Prevention services and other community support services.

 - Elderly persons, persons with poor mental health, persons with poor physical health, at-risk youth, developmentally disabled, physically disabled, drug users, preschool students, grade school students, high school students, victims of crime over 800
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Improve medical and trauma patient survivability; Improve Fire Suppressions Operations and reduce loss of life due to fires; Improve stroke victim outcomes; Reduce psychiatric transport times; Expand Public Education and Fire Safety programs; Improve overall response times, transport arrival times and to provide more personnel on the scene of emergencies quicker Methodology: Reducing response times of ALS transport units; Having a fully staffed fire station respond to a fire scene allows firefighting operation to begin sooner; Transport units will arrive on scene sooner, decreasing the overall transport time to a stroke, psychiatric or other specialized treatment center; The ability to offer the same education programs to the residents of this

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area, in a facility more convenient for them to attend; Providing a facility that is capable of being fully staffed by professional firefighters and paramedics and housing specialized apparatus and equipment.

 Loss of appropriation and reallocation of funding.
