a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The requested funding will provide the State of Florida with a comprehensive, objective, and detailed report indicating if/where specific areas of the audited state agency websites are not compliant with ADA requirements for accessibility for persons with disabilities. This will afford the State of Florida the opportunity to remedy and remove liability of litigation from Florida residents.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Lighthouse Works' Digital Accessibility Services team will conduct a rigorous automated and manual (by Lighthouse Works' blind analyst) audit of the state agency website page-types, as well as every unique workflow. Lighthouse Works will produce and deliver a detailed website audit report, including where the website fails compliance, with source code and recommended source code necessary to correct the violation and remedy the liability(ies).

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Lighthouse Works' Digital Accessibility Services team will help the State of Florida ensure its state agency websites are fully accessible to Floridians living with disabilities.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Target population served is every Florida resident living with a disability. e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Floridians will have access to all aspects of state agency websites, services, and information. Digital Accessibility testing will validate outcomes, per WCAG/508 website compliance standards. Lighthouse Works analysts will run automated accessibility testing tools on state agency websites, followed by manual testing performed by blind analysts. The analysts will then produce and deliver a detailed website audit report, including where the website fails compliance, with source code and recommended source code necessary to correct the violation and remedy the liability(ies).
