4. Project/Program Description:

The existing grass turf fields suffer with poor drainage, resulting in flooded fields during even modest rain events, halting play and disrupting planned events. The existing building and parking facilities struggle to meet existing needs and simply will not be capable of meeting planned future needs. With improved drainage, maintenance and turnaround time for field preparation will decrease which will allow several more months for games and practices and accommodation for demands of additional sanctioned sports activities.

Parking will be provided on an adjacent existing parcel to the east that the City purchased. The existing parcel, which has a parking lot and building pad, is planned to be re-designed for maximum efficient parking. 11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The new facility will meet the needs of the growing number of Plantation residents and host additional sporting and community events. With improved infrastructure support, the Parks and Recreation Department will be able to increase programming and make current programs available throughout the year, rather than seasonally. It will also increase events hosted at the facility, providing an economic benefit to the surrounding area.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Improvement of existing fields will allow for year round activities and increased recreational programming and hosted sporting activities.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

This recreation facility is heavily used today for sanctioned soccer programs. There is a demand to accommodate additional sanctioned sports such as Lacrosse. The existing building and parking facilities struggle to meet existing needs and simply will not be capable of meeting planned future needs.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

In the past year 40,000 regional, national and international athletes participated in tournaments hosted by the City of Plantation, held on field such as those found within Pine Island Park, and 115,000 spectators attend these events. The residents of the City would benefit as well as businesses within and in surrounding areas of the City with expanded program offerings.

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e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Once the renovations of Pine Island Park are complete, an increase of several thousand participants and spectators are expected. With improved drainage, maintenance and turnaround time for field preparation will decrease which will allow several more months for games and practices for residents. With additional participants and events, the City and the surrounding restaurants, hotels and other attractions within the region will enjoy an increase of local community revenue impact of approximately \$2 million dollars.

Failure to meet deliverables or performance measures will result in reduction or loss of funding.
