DREAM'S programming focuses on sparking life-long interest in STEM in youth of color in grades K-8 (six to thirteen years old). DREAM'S flagship program, DREAM Academy, is a blended, STEM and sports-based afterschool youth development program with a culturally competent curriculum that provides homework assistance, develops positive behaviors, and drives improved student outcomes in reading, writing, math, science, health, and art. STEM Saturdays transforms community centers into "Incubators of Excellence" by engaging youth ages 7-16 through STEM activities on the weekends at no cost to participants and their families.

11. Program Performance:



a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

The funds requested will be used to expand our current work with youth through STEM engagement with DREAM Academy (after-school program) and STEM Saturdays (weekend STEM Enrichment) in Miami-Dade and orange County. Dibia DREAMS programming focuses on sparking life-long interest in STEM in youth of color in grades K-8 (six to thirteen years old). Students receive a wide range of resources such as weekly education workshops, STEM projects, field trips and mentors to help them win at life.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Students receive a wide range of resources such as weekly education workshops, STEM projects, field trips and speakers. Students are offered a wide range of opportunities including homework help, tutoring and mentorship, and activities such as painting, sports, and interaction with mentors, free haircuts and monthly dental screenings.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Through DREAM Academy and STEM Saturdays, scholars will engage in hands on activities to enhance their development. Through our blended, STEM and sports-based after-school youth development program with a culturally competent curriculum that provides homework assistance, develops positive behaviors, and drives improved student outcomes in reading, writing, math, science, health, and art.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

Our target demographic, K-12 students of color from low-income communities in Miami-Dade & Orange county. The student population in these areas are 91% African-American and 9% Hispanic, with 94% of students eligible for free or reduced lunch. 800 students.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Program outcomes include improvement in attendance, overall school rating, average student GPAs, FSA math scores, reduction in crimes rates, increase interest in STEM related subject and program completion. Methods for capturing the data above are pre/post assessments, student and parent surveys, report cards, daily attendance sheets, FSA scores, Dibles and Terranova assessments and principal surveys.

Dibia DREAM will have program objectives and performance measures. If they are not met, will have to explain why and may have to return funds.
