4. Project/Program Description:

Minorities for Medical Marijuana (M4MM) in partnership with ACLU of Florida aim to reduce the likelihood of black market growing and selling of marijuana by people of color. Unfortunately, the legalization of Florida's Medical Marijuana program may be interpreted as an opportunity for individuals who think growing and selling the plant on the black market may be a means to make money. Historically, individuals who have been charged with minor drug offenses have a hard time entering the job market and subsequently contemplate the "get rich" quick easy black market opportunity. We believe these individuals 18+ years old with a minor marijuana charge are prime candidates who can benefit from our expungement services program. We believe offering this service along with career exploration, work readiness, and work- force development wrap around services can counter-intuitively reduce crime and the subsequent cost related to recidivism.

11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

In partnership with community partners such as the ACLU of Florida M4MM will provide pre-expungement qualification, expungement, and wrap around workforce development services at no cost to participants. It is our goal to offer range of services that include case management, mentoring, education and training services to program participants for one year. The funds will be used to support expenses associated with providing these services, especially workforce development. Once participants qualify and receive expungement services we are committed to providing the support needed to help them enter the workforce in fulltime career centric positions.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Pre Qualification Expungement and Expungement Services - This program component will provide legal services that directly support the delivery of prequalification, expungement and diversion services. Workforce Readiness - This component will provide resume building, interviewing skills, job placement, development of cognitive and soft skills that participants will need to succeed in future jobs and that support one or more workplace competencies. Mentoring - This component will provide adult mentors for program participants. This component may include one-on-one mentoring, group mentoring, and/or service-based mentoring. Followup - This component will track the progress made by participants in employment and training after program exit.

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c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

Pre qualification Expungement Services, Expungement Services, Case Management Services, Workforce Readiness Instruction and Education, Mentoring, and Post Followup.

- d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?
 - Florida residents residing in blighted communities with a high crime and poverty rate. Focusing on individuals who have an ajudication withheld charge for a minor marijuana possession. Priority services for Veterans and spouses of Veterans. We plan on serving 100 individuals.
- e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

Listed below are the outputs and outcomes measures we will be prepared to report on at the end of the 2019-2020 fiscal year. Enrollment Rate- the enrollment rate is defined as the number of participants enrolled in the program divided by the enrollment goal (Goal: 100%). Expungement Rate-The percentage of participants receiving expungement services who have at least one charge expunged (Goal: 60%). Retention Rate-The retention rate is defined as the number of enrollees employed or attending school divided by all enrollees who are at the 3-month follow-up point (Goal: 50%). Mentoring Rate-The mentoring rate is defined as the percentage of participants who receive mentoring for six months (Goal: 95%). Recidivism Rate-The recidivism rate is defined as the number of program participants who have been convicted of a new criminal offense within 12 months of record expungement (Goal: 20%).
