11. Program Performance:

a. What is the specific purpose or goal that will be achieved by the funds requested?

Homelessness in Osceola County has long been identified as a symptom of the lack of affordable housing. With more than 5,200 homeless children (1,100 of them residing in hotels) and affordable housing units at an alltime low, building housing is the only sustainable solution to this problem. The devastating affects of Hurricane Maria exacerbated the issue by adding over 2,700 homeless children to the area, further impacting local housing resources. Funds will help alleviate homelessness by constructing bridge housing.

b. What are the activities and services that will be provided to meet the intended purpose of these funds?

Housing and wraparound services - homelessness to permanent housing pipeline.

c. What are the direct services to be provided to citizens by the appropriations project?

The project will provide furnished apartment units with case management, education, and employment services.

d. Who is the target population served by this project? How many individuals are expected to be served?

The target population includes jobless persons, economically disadvantaged persons, at-risk youth, and the homeless. The project is expected to serve 101-200 individuals.

e. What is the expected benefit or outcome of this project? What is the methodology by which this outcome will be measured?

The benefits include reducing health issues associated with homelessness, enhancing an individual's economic self sufficiency, and reducing homelessness and hunger related crimes.

Standard contract penalties.
