4. Project/Program Description:

This road provides connectivity to over 40,000 people in Broward County and beyond. It connects over 4,000 local residents. The road serves residential, commercial, and low industrial facilities. The road has 11,000 trips per day, all within a local residential area connecting NE 14th Street and Atlantic Boulevard. The roadway provides the only other alternative to A1A as an evacuation route within its boundaries. There are insufficient sidewalks to provide a safe passage for children and residents. Street lighting is lacking and the public has voiced their concern for safety. There is severe ponding conditions along the corridor and the roadway is prone to flooding.
